PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The year 2018-19 saw the VRWC continue its long tradition of providing regular, well-organised racing walking competition. At a time when the sport faces upheaval internationally (the introduction of electronic shoe judging and the survival of the classic 20 and 50km distances being the centre of much heated debate) our Club, like those interstate, remains focused upon fostering the sport and encouraging its growth.

Our lease arrangement with Middle Park Bowling Club has been revised. We now have a 5-year lease, with an increased but fixed rental over that period. This gives our tenancy more security. We have also had consultation with the MPBC's architect on the matter of planned major renovations to the property, and it appears the MPBC is keen to accommodate our Club's needs in its planning. Details of work commencement dates etc. are yet to be advised.

Membership remains stable, with race attendance over the winter slightly up on average against that of 2018. The bulk of these competitors again consist of regular senior and Masters members, with a sprinkling of earnest juniors whose development has been encouraging to observe.

A recruiting drive aimed at the Little Aths community resulted in some fresh young faces joining us this winter. Importantly, this approach got the VRWC's name, logo and identity out there, and the gains made, though small, were encouraging. These efforts will continue. The various LAVic competitions are a rich source of young potential members who, it is hoped, will be motivated to engage seriously in the sport via our racing program. They (and their parents) just have to know about us.

So do their coaches. Informed, authoritative and committed coaching is a crucial element of (a) introducing newcomers to the sport and the Club, and (b) getting them to stay, pursue goals and extend their abilities and experience. As the VRWC provides a competitive rather than a coaching/training platform, we rely on individual coaches (usually tied to Little Aths or Masters venues) to provide novice walkers with that vital early grounding in the sport, while we provide their racing opportunities. Reaching out to coaches who may not as yet be aware of the VRWC or its activities is surely another means of attracting new members.

It's paramount that we maintain the Club's visual identity. To this end, committee member Shane Dickson has been active in arranging a re-vamped design of our VRWC racing uniform. The design settled upon – which still features our traditional navy and white colours - has been circulated for feedback among the membership, and we look forward to seeing our members racing in it next year.

On the racing front, the Club was again well represented internationally. Jemima Montag and Rhydian Cowley carried the colours in horrendous conditions at the IAAF championships in Doha, with Jemima achieving a stunning 10th place in the 20km. Although succumbing to the heat and humidity in Doha, Rhydian, as tough as they come, bounced back to take 3rd place in the Lake Taihu 3-day classic in China. Kyle Swan also participated in this compelling series, gaining valuable experience.

Speaking of 'tough', no praise is too high for our popular Kiwi member, Quentin Rew. Our sole rep in the Doha 50km (albeit wearing the silver fern), Quentin deployed his resources perfectly, working his way through a tiring field to cross in 11th place. Quentin is also one of the most articulate and persuasive advocates there are for the 50km's international retention. Well done, Q !

At home, VRWC members (and their RWV country counterparts) proved too strong overall for their interstate opposition, with the points they amassed during the Lake Burley Griffin carnival, Interstate Challenge and Australian championships in Adelaide winning us the Brennan Shield once again. Well done, everyone – especially Rhydian Cowley, Kyle Swan and Adam Garganis who swept the medals in the Adelaide 20km.

In Masters competition, Heather Carr, Tracey Feiner, Gwen Steed and a resurgent Andrew Jamieson were the standouts, with Heather setting another world record, this time in the 70yrs category over 3km. It has also been encouraging to see newcomers in the Masters category approach the Club and try their hand at the sport. May they keep coming back, and may we welcome more in 2020.

Off the course, efforts continue to enhance the Club's financial and social health. Last year's successful Twilight Trivia evening was repeated in July, with a small but welcome increase in funds raised. Additionally, a sausage sizzle (not held at our Club for several years) accompanied our Winter presentations celebration and was warmly received by all. We are also seeking to engage in the sausage sizzle fundraiser initiative provided for local communities by Bunnings Hardware. Other social activities, such as a wine-tasting evening, have been suggested, and more ideas to enhance the Club's social identity are always welcome.

A perennial challenge on race days is having enough hands to the wheel. We plan to embark on a roster system of helper/officials for next winter, encouraging all of our supporters, including parents, to step up and assist in any way they can with the running of our program. None of the duties is difficult, not do they require specific technical expertise. (The RFID timing system has been mothballed until a suitable software package can be found.) But, big or small, all duties – fetching, carrying, setting up, pulling down, taking race entries, recording, timekeeping, packing away, canteen service – need to be done. At present there are precious few to do them regularly, and none of us is getting younger. Days where there've been multiple absentees amongst our regular officials have left us seriously exposed, and any breakdown in provision for the needs of our athletes leads to an unsatisfactory and diminished experience for all. Remember, every little bit helps!

Finally, my thanks to everyone who has played a part, major or minor, to help provide a successful, happy and enjoyable program and environment for our members. Terry Swan (secretary), Karyn O'Neill (treasurer), Mark Donahoo (handicapper, race program coordinator, Club coach and competition manager), Peter Vysma (judging coordinator, equipment manager, handyman and AV delegate) and, of course, Tim Erickson OAM (race day manager, Club archivist, race referee, editor of "Heel & Toe Online"), have all played indispensable roles in the Club's functioning. A special thanks, also, to Ralph Bennett, whose weekly efforts to prepare the irritable RFID timing system often cost him his own racing opportunities.

To our Committee (Shane Dickson, Terry O'Neill, Donna Elms, Heather Carr, Bob Gardiner, Michael Bodey and Madeleine Feain); our judges (Gordon Loughnan, Kathleen Marsh, Di Lowden, David Cash, Shane, Terry O'Neill, Charlotte Holmes, Mark O'Mahoney and Fran Attard); our Canteen staff (Kate Suich, Wendy Cooper, Eija Heikkila and Donna Elms); our race officials, timekeepers and helpers – Ian Laurie, Donna Dickson, Cheryl Beveridge, Gerard Feain, Bill Carr, Simon Baker OAM, Jim Leppik and everyone else who chipped in with assistance when it was needed – thanks and well done!

Once again, we thank Neil Ryan of Runner's World in Kew, who continues to support our high-achieving walkers with his generous financial and equipment awards in both seasons. We also thank Nate Zeeno, David Spokes and their staff at the Middle Park Bowling club for their cooperation and assistance.

And thanks, also, to the walkers themselves, who turn up each week and make the most of the opportunities provided by the Club. We hope to continue providing what each of you needs to enjoy the sport and to realize your goals.

FINANCIAL YEAR - 1 October 2018 - 30 September 2019

The period of October 2018 to September 2019 was a reasonably good year for the Club although not as good as last year, and we finished the year with a Loss of \$1,035.28.

Membership numbers were up on last year, with many new junior members who have started to race this year, taking advantage of the opportunity to race and have done so consistently.

Consequently, the race day receipts were up on the last financial year, although the competitors in the events the club has staged for the Masters was down on last year.

Most of the uniform was purchased prior to Lake Burley Griffin, but there was still quite a bit purchased either by new members or as replacements, and the income from uniform is almost the same as last year.

This year, as last year, the Club has done some additional fund-raising in the form of a Trivia Night which was well attended, and enjoyed by all. There were also some Raffles that were organised as additional fund-raisers with thanks to Donna for all her work with this.

The gifts were for the helpers and judges, and the donation is \$358.00 to 'Fight MND' on behalf of the family of Marlaine Stanway - a longstanding member of VRWC.

The Membership expenses listed are for membership of Athletics Victoria and Race Walking Victoria.

Licence Fee is for Parks Victoria, to enable us to use the track for races.

There are a few items in the Miscellaneous Expenses, the course certification to enable the club to stage events for AV and AA, refreshments for the judges in the AV events, and the food for the Barbeque at the end of Winter Season.

The Club this year has made a Loss, but the Club still has a sound financial base with which to move forward into the next year, to continue to provide members with the benefits of experience and camaraderie in a sport we all love.

I would like to thank all the committee members for their support.
