## LYN VENTRIS - MASTERS SUPREMO

I have spoken on a number of occasions in the newsletter about the ongoing walking feats of Lyn Ventris of Western Australia. Lyn is by far and away the top W50 walker in the world and has cut a swathe through the World and Australian Masters walking records on her way up through the age groups. She is due to turn 55 in October so I thought it was about time I zoomed in with an indepth profile. Thanks to her husband John who provided lots of the information below.

Lyn has always kept fit and healthy 'doing something'. She was an 'A' Grade squash player and also played a bit of tennis but 'fitness' walking was always prominent in her fitness regimen. Eventually gym sessions were introduced, working on the theory that the legs were getting a work out but the upper body could do with more. That was 15 years ago and she still religiously goes to the gym for Personal Training sessions a couple of times a week.

It was not until a friend introduced Lyn to 'official' athletics race walking in 1996 that she became keen on the sport and, with the Masters National Athletics Championships in Perth that year (1996), it was an ideal goal for which to aim.

Lyn won her age group in both races but it wasn't until she competed in the World Masters Athletics Championships at Gateshead in England (1999), coming third in the 5000m track walk and fifth in the 10km road walk and being beaten by the Americans, that she decided to get a coach and get serious.

She initially tried a coach in Perth before moving to Mark Donahoo and then received good advice from Andrew Jamieson and Simon Baker and is now again with Mark. Lyn speaks with Mark regularly and has her programs planned by Mark.

At the next Masters Athletics World Championships in Brisbane in 2001, she not only beat the Americans but won both events (5000m and 10km), beating all other age groups outright. Lyn has since competed at further World Masters Athletics Championships in San Sebastian-Spain 2005 (winning all events outright), Riccione-Italy 2007 and Lahti-Finland (winning all events outright and bringing home four gold medals). Lyn is to compete in Sacramento at the next World Masters Athletics Championships in July this

year and we hope for more of the same in her new W55 age group..

The times Lyn did in Brisbane in 2001 opened the door even further to enable her to compete against athletes more than half her age in open race walking events.

Lyn decided to start competing in the WA State Open Athletics Championships and has won the 5000m and 10000m Open track walks for many years now. Lyn has also won the State Open Championship 20km road walk a number of occasions including last year. Last Wednesday evening, in very hot and humid conditions, she won her latest State title, the 2011 WA Open 10000m track championship.

Lyn says that Racewalking is a great way to prove that life doesn't stop at 30, 40 or 50 as far as being competitive

Even though I have taken my racewalking to another level through Masters Athletics, it is important to me to get the message across to others that participation is the key and I am willing to help anyone that would like to focus on improving their health through a sensible diet and exercise program.

It is particularly difficult at times as Lyn trains on her own in Bunbury two hours south of Perth. She mainly trains on courses mapped out around her home suburb of Australind. Bunbury also now has an IAAF standard athletics track.

A typical training week could include

Monday Speed session and Gym

Tuesday Bike or Pool and Afternoon hills Wednesday Speed session and Gym

Thursday Hill Run/Walk and Afternoon 5km/pool

Friday Distance and Gym

Saturday Distance Sunday Rest

With a lack of any competitions locally and not being able to get to Perth for many regular events, it is the major championships that she targets. Lyn says winning any events at the World Masters Athletics championships are highlights but a 10km road walk in 47.25 at Chipping Norton in Sydney at Easter in 2001 was memorable because she felt so good that it didn't even feel as if she had competed. Her 10000m on the track when third to Jane and Natalie Saville to record her best time of 46.35 in 2002 was also memorable and being first across the line in the English 20km road walk championship in 2005 at Earls Colne in Essex was also one to remember.


Lyn's PBs are very impressive, especially considering that they have all been done in the 40+ age groups. It begs the question – what could she have done if she had come into our sport earlier.

One of my most memorable recollections in recent years was in December 2008 when she competed in the AA 50km meet, coming 3<sup>rd</sup> in the Invitational Open 20km with 1:45:13. It was a case of two for the price of one with Lyn breaking the W50 20km record by some 3 minutes and Andrew Jamieson breaking the M60 50km record, one of the toughest on the books.
