### 7<sup>TH</sup> SPRINT TRIATHLON IN RACE WALKING, VEENENDAAL, NETHERLANDS, SATURDAY 10 SEPTEMBER

### VERONICA BURKE AND RICK LIESTING WIN THE 7th SPRINT TRIATHLON IN RACE WALKING

The 7<sup>th</sup> international sprint triathlon in race walking was won by Veronica Burke (Ireland) and Rick Liesting (the Netherlands). On Saturday the  $10^{th}$  of September, 34 walkers from 5 countries came to Veenendaal (the Netherlands) to start on one, two or all three distances: 3000m, 1000m and 1 mile on the track. The youngest participant, Marit van Bremen, was born in 2013 and the oldest participant, Bauke te Nijenhuis, was born in 1935. The 2016 edition was a hard one. It was clear and sunny and the temperature hit 27°C (in the shadoe of which there was none on the track).

Last year's winner Rob Tersteeg (NED) and last year's runner up Rick Liesting (NED) battled it out in the 3000m. Liesting started very fast at 16 km/h speed. After 2000m however Tersteeg overtook the lead and he won easily in 13.05,6. Liesting followed in 13.07,4. Remco de Bruin (NED), M50, was third in a fast 14.16,4. Tersteeg didn't defend his 2015 victory on the other distances, so the 39 year old Liesting could easily win the other two races with times of 4.09,8 (1000m) and 6.59,9 (1 mile). In two hours the race walker from Deventer set three personal bests. In the general classification (gc) Remco de Bruin came second and Peter Van Hove (BEL) was third. Places 4 to 8 were fiercely contested by walkers from Poland, Germany and the Netherlands with Polish walker Miroslaw Luniewski (M55) just making it ahead Hub Kaenen (NED), Boguslaw Seidel (POL), Udo Schaeffer (GER) and Wilfried van Bremen (NED).

After a second place in 2015 behind Agnieska Dygacz (POL), Veronica Burke from Ireland took the overall honours in 2016. The 19 year old won with a big margin and brought home a second Irish victory after Kate Veale in 2012. In fact, the Dublin based walker would have been third in the men's competition. Two-time winner Liesbet De Smet (BEL) was second this time and Corina Riezebos (NED) made her debut with a third place.

The youth races were won by the Belgian Tristan Van Hove (boys) and Lola Gontier (girls). Local walker Tygo Hulsebos made a good impression with a second place behind Van Hove.

This year's racde was special as it saw the participation of a number of visually disabled athletes. Two of them walked with a companion.

The teams race was won by a team that was put together for the occasion: Miroslaw Luniewski (POL), Udo Schaeffer (GER) and Tristan Van Hove (BEL).

At the price ceremony the prizes for combativeness went to the two Polish participants and the prices for good walking style were given to two female beginners.

In the afternoon, a number of the walkers did a 10km endurance training walk in the hills near Prattenburg, on the Amerongse berg and along the Eenzame Eik (lonely oak). At 4:45PM they ended their race walking day which had started at 9.15AM with a coaching session/joint warm up.

### **ROUBAIX 28 HOURS WALK, ROUBAIX, FRANCE, 17-18 SEPTEMBER**

On Saturday Emmanuel Tardi was in Roubaix for the traditional 28 Heures de Roubaix. The organizers had to change the circuit at the last week due to security issues and the main 1.982km lap was held around the historic Roubaix cycling velodrome in the Parc des Sports. The start was at 11am on Saturday and the finish was at 3pm on Sunday. There was 40 starters including Australian Michelle Thompson.

The course was a tough one. The velodrome section saw competitors walking on clay, like the surface of the old athletics tracks. As one part of the velodrome was very wet, walkers were forced to walk on the thin cement rim adjacent to the inclined bicycle track surface to avoid the mud. Walkers also had to walk down onto the velodrome interior and then walk up out of the velodrome each lap. The lap also included 3 180 degree turns, as well as a variety of walking surfaces, adding to the complexity. Consequently, most walkers were down on projected times as they struggled to maintain their rhythm and pace.

In the men's event, the early leaders were **Dmitryi Osipov, Eddy Roze, Aleksei Kondratenko** and **Zoltan Czukor** but Czukor was stopped for 20 minutes by judges for 3 red cards after the first 3 hours. Roze stopped after 10 hours and Kondratenko slowed down when the night arrived. **Christophe Laborie** and **Yves-michel Kerlau** were 5<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> in the early part of the race but slowly climbed up the order as others walkers stopped or slowed down, eventually finished on the podium behind winner Ossipov who walked 223.907km. His splits read impressively: 100km in 11:08:49, 100 miles in 19:02:38, 198.448km in 24 hours and 223.907km in 28 hours.

In the women's event, it was a 'one woman show' for Australian walker **Michelle Thompson.** She walked 51,5km in her first 6 hours, took 12:24:48 for 100km and then finally slowed as the night arrived, reaching the 100 mile mark in 21:49:53 and clocking 175.904km in the first 24 hours. Overall finished 10<sup>th</sup> overall with a distance of 198.647km for the full 28 hours. She had looked set to better 200km but could only manage 23km in the final 4 hours (10km in the last 2 hours) as the fatigue factor took its toll. Such is the nature of this sort of super-endurance event.

The other 9 did not complete both events.

Polish great Robert Korzenioski made it look easy in the 2000 Olympics in Sydney when he won both the 20km and 50km but it is in fact an extremely tough double to attempt. Evan has also done some good detective work to work out the best efforts in the last 2 Olympic cycles (2008-2016). It is no surprise to see that Jared Tallent dominates the table with the top 3 doubles, done in the 2008 Olympics in Beijing, the 2012 Olympics in London and the 2009 World Champs in Berlin.

The moral of the story - it is almost impossible to train successfully for this double. Your performance in one or other of the 2 events will be compromised. It takes a special walker to do well in both events in the one meet.
