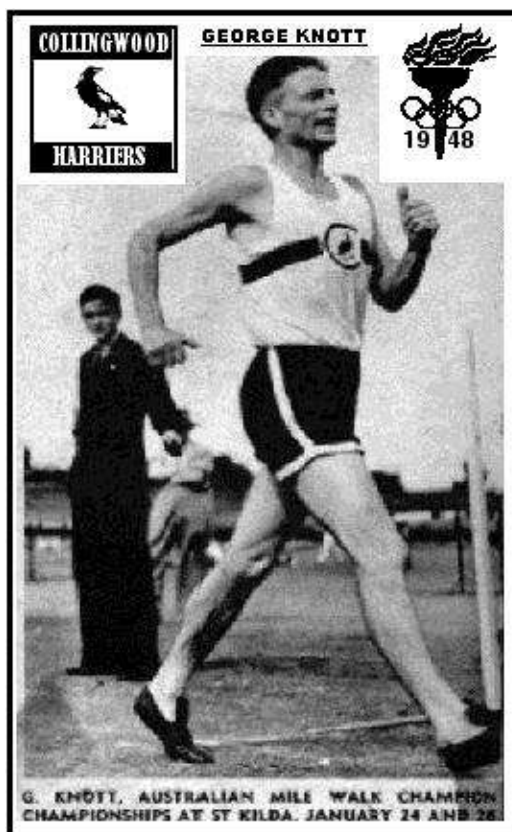

VALE GEORGE KNOTT – 1911-2001

This year we lost one of our most revered life members in George Knott. We are privileged to have known George and his memory will live on in VRWC with the institution of the George Knott Trophy which will be awarded to the winner of the Mens Open 5000m Walk at the Athletics Victorian Championships.



George joined the Collingwood Harriers on 02/12/1929 and thus was started an athletics career that lasted some 70 years.

He competed in many events as most did then, but specially middle distance and pole vault. In 1930 he had his first race walk in a club championship, and from then on mixed running and walking.

Coached by lifetime friend Bill Tunaley, George improved his times and from 1936 onwards, he won many Victorian walk championships, as well as the Australian Championships over 1 mile and 10,000 metres.

By 1940, George was club captain but, with the outbreak of war, the club was disbanded. It was not until 1946 that re-establishment occurred and after things settled down, he was in top form once again, winning the 1947 Australian 10 km title and setting a world best time for 10,000 metres walk. This gained him selection for the 1948 Olympics in London. In that event he finished 7th in his heat in the 10,000m walk.

He continued to race A grade at Interclub for many years, and would step in when the team was short of a walker, and he continued in the lower grades until the 1970s. In veteran competition George and Bill Tunaley would line up for field games, jumps, steeplechases and walks, as they had done in their youth, and George raced with the VRWC up till his late eighties. There wasn't a trick that George didn't know, and he taught the other Collingwood walkers how to use them to the club's advantage. To confuse the opposition, he would take the front row and just before the gun he would give his mate an almighty shove in the back so that he would find himself way out in front with George hot on his heels.

George was a member of VRWC from the 1930s onwards and was one of the stalwarts over many years. His life membership was awarded in 1964 but he remained an active member of the club for many years after that. But his activities were not restricted to VRWC. He was also awarded life memberships of Athletics Victoria and Collingwood Harriers and was awarded an Australian Sports Medal in 2000.

George died in early 2001 at the age of 90, leaving a legacy of 70 years of involvement in athletics as both a fierce competitor and as an official.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The past 12 months have been satisfying for the VRWC. For the first year since occupying our Middle Park premises we have been able to balance our finances, thanks mainly from the support of our members on race days.

Melbourne Water has finally removed the speed humps from our preferred course following persistent lobbying and persuasion by the committee. Having seen many courses in Australia and many parts of the world over the past 48 years, I believe we now have the best. We have 3 alternate courses available at Middle Park and plans to alter the path adjacent to the golf driving range will give us the opportunity to create yet another world class circuit.

The committee have identified our market - the people we need to cater for - we are getting good support from our under age and veteran walkers and will design our racing programs to ensure these groups are serviced. We welcome any feedback from the members to assist in our endeavours to satisfy all walkers.

Mark Donahoo's coaching sessions have been a valuable contribution to the club and help lift the standard of Victorian Walking.

Our committee meetings have been of a high standard with some lively debate and positive decisions. I would like to thank the committee for their untiring efforts throughout the year.

Without our volunteer officials and judges there would not be any competition. We should never underestimate the value of our team and should appreciate how lucky we are to have such an experienced and enthusiastic group.

Our social committee is also a great asset; their fundraising efforts and canteen duties are very much appreciated.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Dear Members

We have had a very good year, due to a few lucky breaks. At the end of our financial year we received \$5000 from the Estate of George Knott. During the year, we were also paid \$1160 for running the Australian Championships (2000 and 2001). Our subscriptions were slightly up and race fees increased by \$1200.

As for expenses, we will be transferring monies next month from our investment accounts to cover the \$784 we paid out in Club Teams Fund and Merrifield Awards. Our Public Liability dropped significantly from \$1859 to \$822 due to a new insuring covering our sport. Our postage seems a huge expense but I don't consider it excessive. We have a number of big mailouts each year and there is plenty of correspondence to be dealt with. There was also postage associated with our 80th Anniversary celebration in November.

All our expenses for administration, trophies and rentals are fairly reasonable. It was also the first full financial year that the GST had an impact, be it reasonable, over the whole 12 months.

Unfortunately, during the year, interest rates dropped markedly from 4-5.5% to 3-3.25%, a drop of 40%. This means that the interest that we spend on Club Teams Fund and Merrifield Awards becomes less. There is not much that I can do about this and neither will it change.

I look forward to once again serving the Club as Treasurer in the coming year.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

This year, our club membership was 120. This membership was split between 102 competitive members and 18 non-competitive members who were in various categories – general supporters, officials and life members.

The 102 competitive members were split into age groups as follows

Over half our competitive membership is Under 20 or younger.

During the course of the year, 149 walkers availed themselves of our various races. Of these 149, 102 were members of the club. The remainder were either racing in special events such as Victorian Championships, Victorian Veteran Championships or Schools Championships or racing as visitors.

Thus there would seem to be room for increasing our membership. There are always further areas to be tapped. These include

- the summer walkers who compete in Interclub but who do not choose to enhance their walking with a winter season of roadwalking
- the many veteran walkers who compete at their local veteran venues
- the school and Little Athletics based walkers.

Our challenge is to continue to build our membership and remain a strong and active force in Victorian athletics.

There is also a strong racewalking presence in country Victoria. Active sister clubs are to be found in Ballarat, Bendigo and Geelong. All clubs came together once again to send a strong team to Canberra to compete in the Australian Federation of Race Walking Clubs in June 2001. It is pleasing to see us all joining as one state based organisation after a number of years of fragmentation in Victoria.

VRWC also hosted a series of championships during the course of the year. These included

- The Australian 50 Km Championship and Selection Trial for the 2001 World Championships
- All except one of the Athletics Victoria Roadwalking championships
- The Athletics Victoria Schools Roadwalking championships
- The Victorian Veteran Assn Roadwalking championships
- Our own VRWC club championships.

Thus we can indeed lay claim to be at the centre of Melbourne and Victorian based walking.
