SECRETARY'S REPORT

Over the last 5 years, our membership has been as follows

At a time when the future of Track and Field Athletics is being questioned in Australia, the Victorian Race Walking Club continues to grow and to provide an environment that attracts walkers, both new and old.

This year, our membership was split between 125 competitive members and 13 non-competitive members who were in various categories – general supporters, officials and life members. The 125 competitive members were split into age groups (as based on our age cutoff date of 1 October 2004) as follows

Our weekly racing numbers averaged about 55 competitors throughout the winter and this meant that races were always keenly contested. Additionally, many of our top walkers competing regularly, providing strong role models for our younger walkers. I remember when I was a young walker and could look up to the likes of Bob Gardiner, Ted Allsopp and Noel Freeman who raced weekly. For many years, our top walkers disappeared to the AIS and the club suffered as a result. This year, our top walkers led by example and the club was all the healthier for it.

This year, the Committee oversaw the purchase of various pieces of equipment – a new pie warmer and urns for the kitchen, a new vacuum cleaner and 2 new printout stopwatches. We were also recipients of a Telstra Athletics Australia Sporting grant which saw the club take possession of a $3m \times 3m$ shade tent. This is now used regularly for our club races and we acknowledge the generous support that Telstra gives to our sport of Athletics in Australia.

The Committee ratified a VRWC Sunsafe policy this year and is conscious of the need to show all possible care for its members. This adds to our existing policies which include a Public Health and Safety Policy and those policies encapsulated in our own By Laws and Rules of Association. These may all be viewed on our club website.

Our club archives continue to grow and this year we were lucky enough to receive further historical memorabilia from Deanna Rahill (NSWRWC) and the widow of the late Alex Philpott. Various articles have been published throughout the year in the 'Heel and Toe' magazine and my own book 'Once Were Walkers' was published some months ago. Today we are proud to add to this ongoing process with the publication of our club history. Special thanks must be accorded to Mark Donahoo who has overseen the project, collated information from many areas and added his own research into the melting pot.

One of the many offshoots of the Club History project was a review of the many people who, although not life members, have worked hard to build the club in years past. We are also proud today to announce the inaugural Merit Awards which recognize the contribution of these many hard working people.

Recently, a new 3 year lease was negotiated with Parks Victoria. This ratifies ongoing access to our walking tracks within the Albert Park Reserve. That, combined with our ongoing leasing arrangement with the Middle Park Bowling

Club, gives us security and enables us to confidently plan for the future. We acknowledge in this report the ongoing support of the MPBC and hope that our relationship with them will continue for many years.

This year, we continued to constructively build our relationship with the country walking clubs in a number of ways.

Once again we combined with our sister walking clubs in Ballarat and Geelong to field a joint team in the Australian Federation of Race Walking Clubs Carnival in Canberra where over 40 members competed.

In January this year, a new entity, Racewalking Victoria, was formed with the following 5 people representing their clubs

Russell McFarlane (Barwon Walkers) Harold Boddy (Geelong Walkers Club) Daryl Biggin (Ballarat Race Walking Club) Paul Rance (Bendigo Walkers Club) Tim Erickson (Victorian Race Walking Club)

and on 1st May this year, inaugural Racewalking Victoria championships were held in the U10 and U12 age groupings at the Country Championships carnival held at Albert Park. It is fair to say that we are not really sure at this stage how much or how little Racewalking Victoria will develop but the concept is sound and it recognizes the fact that our clubs can work together to develop racewalking in Victoria.

As usual, VRWC hosted a series of championships during the course of the year. These included

- The Australian 50 Km National Championship
- The Athletics Victoria Country roadwalking championships
- All of the Athletics Victoria Roadwalking championships
- The Athletics Victoria Schools Roadwalking championships
- The Victorian Masters Association Roadwalking championships
- Inaugural Racewalking Victoria championships for U10 and U12 walkers
- Our own VRWC club championships.

Thus we can indeed lay claim to be at the centre of Melbourne and Victorian based walking.

The club maintains many perpetual trophies and today we announce an addition – the Keiko Bowyer Trophy will be awarded annually to the male and female winners of the Winter Season Style Award. Keiko was one of our regular judges at Albert Park until losing her battle against cancer in August this year. Her husband Andrew will today present this new trophy to the club and each year as we present it, we will be reminded of Keiko the person and Keiko the judge.

Many decisions outside our immediate club sphere influence our activities. Some of these are for the better and some are for the worse.

In September 2004, we became aware of a decision to remove the walks from the Pacific Schools Games which are to be held in Melbourne late this month. The club via its committee became involved in a very active campaign to have the walks reinstated. This was not a pleasant activity but it was a necessary one and I am pleased to report that in November 2004 a decision was made to re-incorporate walks into all age groups. I can also announce that a number of our own club members will be competing in this prestigious Schools event in a few weeks time.

At around the same time, Athletics Australia published a Report into the Future of Athletics in Australia. Amongst the many recommendations was one to revamp the various A.A. Committees. As a result, a specialist Walks Committee was formed and Harry Summers and I are amongst the 6 members who now provide input to A.A. on all matters walking. This has already born fruit in a number of ways and will hopefully have a long life. For too long, the walking clubs felt that they had no access into A.A. decision making. This committee can now hopefully remedy that situation.

Many of our members have been in the news during the year. Highlights included

- Ray Smith being recognized by A.V. with awards for 50 Years of Service and 50 Years as an official
- Bob Gardiner being recognized by A.V. with an award for 50 Years of Service.
- Nathan Deakes being recognized by A.A. as Australian Male Athlete of the Year
- Chris Erickson being awarded A.V. Competition Number 1
- Nathan Deakes and Jared Tallent being selected for the 2005 I.A.A.F. World Championships in Helsinki

Nathan in particular dominated the news earlier this year with a number of outstanding performances in the various I.A.A.F. Grand Prix walking events. In March, he won the 20 km in Tijuana in Mexico in 1:21:28 and then in April he was second in the 20 km in Rio Major in Portugal in 1:19:15 and then won the 20 km in Cixi in China in an Oceania record time of 1:17:33. This last performance rocketed him to favouritism for the I.A.A.F. World Championships in Helsinki. It was heartbreaking to hear of his withdrawal firstly from the 20 km event and then form the 50 km event in Helsinki. In a matter of weeks he went from the likelihood of 2 gold medals to the frustration of being unable to compete. We wish him all the best with his rehabilitation and hope to see him back on the track soon.

Next to Nathan, Jared Tallent has been the star walker of the year and we are pleased that, although AIS based, he still keeps up his club membership. Coming off a strong win in the Canberra 20 Mile event (and an excellent debut time of 2:22:39), he came 18th in the World Championship 20 km in Helsinki (1:23:42) before retaining his title in the Australian 30 km roadwalking championship with a PB time of 2:12:58. At 20 years of age, Jared is already at the top of Australian walking and is now set to start his climb up the international tree.

Our Masters walkers also led by example and we are privileged to have more than our fair share of champions in the club. A number of new Masters Records were set during the year and highlights included

- Heather Carr setting a new World W55 5000m record of 15:32:45 on 11/02/2005
- Brenda Riley setting a new Victorian W65 1 Mile record of 8:39.9 on 24/02/2005
- Heather Carr setting a new Australian W55 10 km record of 56:42 on 22/05/2005
- Andrew Jamieson setting a new Australian M55 10 km record of 46:32 on 30/07/2005

At the time of writing, our VRWC walkers are at the fore in the Australian and Commonwealth ranking lists and the club looks set to see a significant number of members selected for both the 2006 Commonwealth Games and the 2006 Racewalking World Cup. Many of our officials have already been selected for key officiating positions at the Melbourne Commonwealth Games and we look forward excitedly for this big event to hit Melbourne early next year.

It takes many people working together to run a successful club like ours. It is always difficult to single out particular people but I would like to mention

- Harry, Bob, Ross and the others who set up and dismantled the equipment each week
- Barb, Joyce and Kate who provided for us all in the canteen and kitchen
- Michael and Ron who took the race entries and look after all money matters
- Paul, Lou, Stuart, Harry and the various helpers and parents who looked after the timekeeping and recording
- Mark who did the handicapping and ran the coaching sessions
- Ray who manned the camera, showed the results after the race and produced the weekly raceday newsletter
- Gordon, Peter, Lloyd and Michael who formed the backbone of our judging panel and who were on deck every week

My apologies to anyone I have missed. There are so many people who make our club tick.

Communication is one of the highlights of our club. Ray's weekly newsletter provides a great selection of information, both historical and topical, and over the course of a season, I think everyone must have featured at least once in the many photos. My own internet based newsletter has a weekly distribution of over 100 email addresses and probably reaches around 150 people. The website is also kept up to date with all racing results as well as other important information. And on top of that, Ray's regular videoing of races lets everyone review their performance and discuss style and technique with the many experts within the club.

Many people comment to me that this club is special as everyone is so friendly and the atmosphere is so good. This is reflected in the large number of people who stay around after the weekly races for socialising and post-race reviewing. I personally feel this is one of the very strong features of the club.

Alas, after 5 years as club secretary, I find myself having to announce that I will not be restanding for that position in the coming year. Although I will continue with my involvement in the club at all levels, recent changes to my work commitments leave me unable to find the necessary time to do everything that I currently do. However, I remain confident that the club will continue to prosper and grow. The club's strength lies in its members and the many people who contribute quietly and consistently to its ongoing wellbeing.

I look forward to being one of those many contributors once again next year.
