VALE RALPH FIELD, 15 DECEMBER 1913 - 7 NOVEMBER 2007

I am saddened to advise that VRWC life member Ralph Field died on November 7th 2007 at The Avenue Hospital after suffering complications related to his 2003 hip replacement surgery. Ralph, born in 1913, was just short of his 94th birthday and had maintained good health up until the last few months.

Ralph was born in Leongatha, Victoria, and raised at Caulfield. His working life started with an apprenticeship as a hand compositor in the printing industry. He joined St Stephen's Harriers at the age of 20 and competed, initially, as a middle distance runner. It was only as a result of a fallen arch in one foot (from running ½ mile and 1 mile races) that he turned to walking and was immediately successful.

Starting in the C grade walk in Interclub competition, he progressed to the St Stephen's A grade team in 1935 – and then remained a member of their A grade team until 1962, a timespan of 27 years.

He was amongst the top Victorians in the late 1940's and 1950's and regularly mixed it with the top Australian walkers of that era. His best Australian championship result was in 1954 when he took bronze in the Australian 50 km championship (5:05:47) behind Les Hellyer and Jim Short. That same year, he took bronzes in the Victorian 10,000m (50:38) and the Victorian 10 Mile championship (1:23:57) and took silver in the Victorian 50 km (5:00:55) behind Les Hellyer, missing gold by the narrow margin of 55 seconds. Ralph's 49:40 performance for the 10k walk in 1953 is the longest-standing St Stephen's club record.

He also represented Victoria in various Australian championships of that era. The photo below shows the Victorian team for the Australian 10,000m Walk Championships which were held in Brisbane in 1955.



Ralph served as an official at the 1956 Melbourne Olympic Games and as a leading racewalking judge for many years. Older members will remember him judging at Melbourne University, Olympic Park and other venues.

He married Maisie Gillam in 1941. Their three sons, Gary, Bruce and Ross followed Ralph into the sport of amateur athletics. Bruce went on to represent Australia in the 1972 Olympic Games and in the 1974 Commonwealth Games, competing over 400m, 400m Hurdles and Long Jump.

Ralph took his family to major athletics competitions held at Olympic Park during the 1950s and 1960s, the golden era of Australian athletics. The Field family also attended virtually all VAWC events and functions during those decades.

Ralph was one of the many VAWC members who helped at the working bees involved in the construction of the Alf Robinson Clubrooms in the early 1960's. His normal task was working alongside Jim Gaylor cleaning bricks and, over many working bees, he gradually helped our clubrooms take shape.


For many years, Ralph and Maisie provided the annual race numbers for VAAA, thus providing valuable club funds for VAWC. This was a huge annual job that involved producing thousands of numbers. Initially other members helped but eventually it was left to Ralph to do it alone. In the early sixties he volunteered to help Alan Hancock in producing the 'Heel and Toe' magazine. Ralph provided the paper and printed the headings while Alan did the editorial work. Even now, the family connection continues as our VRWC racing numbers are supplied by Bruce who prints them as a sideline to his professional career as Associate Professor of Engineering at Monash University. Ralph's oldest son Gary also carried on the family tradition and worked in the printing industry.

Ralph started Melbourne's first printing forme-cutting service and his family actively participated in this highly regarded business. He received world wide recognition for his innovative telescope designs. He also designed and built the special machines and equipment needed to fabricate the optical elements of telescopes.

Ralph was awarded VAWC life membership in 1964 in recognition of his many services to the club. He was earned life memberships of St Stephen's Hawthorn Athletics Club and of Athletics Victoria.

He was VAWC club handicapper for some years and always knew exactly what time he would do. Such was his honest approach to walking that, even after he had retired as handicapper, he was not happy when someone got away with playing dead to get a win.

Personally, I well remember Ralph racing weekly at Albert Park in the sixties and seventies. He was a consummate club man, content to compete each week for fitness to keep his old mate Jim Short company at the back of the field. They started together, walked together and normally finished together. He continued to race until the early 1980's when hip problems forced his retirement.

A hip replacement in the late 1980's gave him a new lease of life and he resumed his walking, competing in the older divisions in Masters competitions. After he wore out his first replacement hip, he had a second operation and then resumed racing! He capped his competitive career with the gold medal for the 85-89 age group 5000m walk in the 2002 World Masters Games, held in Melbourne.

Although we only saw Ralph at Albert Park for the occasional AGM in recent years, he still maintained a keen interest in the club and was kept in the loop by many of our older club members. He will be missed by his many mates in racewalking.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

At a time when other branches of athletics are experiencing falling participation rates, our club has never been healthier. This year our membership hit an all time high of 179. Much of this increase is due to the work of the many coaches, both suburban and country, who bring new blood into our sport and who then point their aspiring walkers to our club. The following figures shows the trend over the last 7 years:

This year, our membership was split between 164 competitive members and 15 non-competitive members who were in various categories – general supporters, officials and life members. The genealogical breakdown (based on age as at 1 October 2006) shows an almost equal split between female and male members but the differences are obvious -we have more young girls than boys walking and we have more older men than women walking. Overall, it all balances out!

A number of these members are country based walkers who join us as a 'second claim' walking club and compete with us when they can. Luckily for us, not everyone races every week but, none the less, this year witnessed record weekly racing numbers, averaging around 70 and surged towards 100 on major championship days.

With the resultant increase in increase in membership subscriptions and racing fees, the club had more money to play with and we endeavoured to feed it all back into facilities and long term planning. Amongst the extra things we were able to do were the following

- the transfer of \$3000 to our Club Teams Fund
- the purchase of a new 6m x 3m shelter for race days
- purchase of a large digital clock for race days (partially funded by a Parks Victoria grant)

Apart from these big ticket items, other smaller matters were dealt with as required

- new shelving was erected in the Secretary's office
- new shelving was erected in the Bowling Club shed for our raceday equipment
- a new bike trailer was built to ease the burden associated with race day setup and pull down
- a well overdue refurbishment of our ageing DQ board was undertaken.

Bob Gardiner was the prime mover behind most if not all of these small ticket initiatives and his expertise and generous donation of time and tools is much appreciated by us all.

Nowadays our winter season is delayed due to the mid March scheduling of the Australian Motor Racing Grand Prix. This year we could not schedule our first races at Albert Park until Sunday 21 April and we expect the same in 2008. We have learnt to live with this intrusion into our yearly calendar and consequently the winter season remains slightly shorter than it used to be.

As usual, VRWC hosted a large number of championships throughout the year. These included

- Three of the four days of Athletics Victoria roadwalking championships
- The Athletics Victoria Schools Roadwalking championships
- The Victorian Masters Association Roadwalking championships

• Our own VRWC club championships.

We shall also host the Victorian and Australian 50 km roadwalking championships at Albert Park on Sunday 16 December 2007.

We donated all takings from one of our racedays to Brain Tumour Research fundraising. What with race fees, some donations from members and a top-up from the club, \$600 was forwarded to the Royal Melbourne Hospital Neuroscience Foundation. I would hope that we can do something similar next year.

VRWC sent teams to participate in both Racewalking Australia Carnivals this year. In June some 70 walkers travelled to Canberra for the Lake Burley Griffin Carnival and then a smaller team travelled to Adelaide in late July for the second Federation Carnival. The good performances of our walkers ensured that we won the Brennen Shield for the first time in many years. We also won the Racewalking Australia State Challenge in July (the fourth time in a row) to cement our place at the top racewalking club in Australia.

Our Masters walkers led by example and we are privileged to have more than our fair share of champions in the club. A number of new World and Australian Masters Records were set during the year by Brenda Riley, Heather Carr, Andrew Jamieson and Ralph Bennett and our Masters walkers continued their good form into the World Masters Championships in September in Riccione in Italy where they won a swag of medals. We are very proud to be able to announce that Andrew Jamieson has recently been recognised as the 2007 IAAF Male Masters Athlete of the Year. It is an award well deserved for this outstanding walker and club man.

We are also privileged to have as club members some of Australia's current top walkers, including Nathan Deakes, Duane Cousins, Jared Tallent, Chris Erickson, Tom Barnes and Kellie Wapshott. Nathan, Duane, Jared and Chris all represented Australia in the IAAF World Championships in Japan in August/September and we were just so excited to witness Nathan win his first ever World Championship gold medal. I am sure we all basked in the reflected glory! On top of that, Tom Barnes was selected to represent Australia in the World University Games in Bangkok in August and walked with distinction in his first international selection.

These elite club members are backed up by a large pool of talented youngsters who will hopefully provide the next generation of champions. Our challenge is to provide a nurturing environment in which they can continue to develop and hone their walking skills until they are ready to take over the mantle.

And, of course, there are the many club members who race for the love of the sport and to maintain their health and well being in a constructive and enjoyable way. All are vitally important to the club.

Communication continues to be well handled. This year, the Heel & Toe newsletter was published 48 times in 52 weeks, probably some sort of record! With Ray Smith and Stuart Cooper providing photographs and with a number of other people providing input, the newsletter was circulated to an ever growing distribution list of over 200 email addresses. Stuart Cooper also fed our results to the Press each week and it was great to see the Monday morning stats in the newspapers once again. On top of that, we have also recently upgraded our website to a paid subscription. This now gives us the capacity to grow the website and host even more information online.

It takes many people working together to run a successful club like ours. It is always difficult to single out particular people but I would like to mention

- Harry, Bob, Ron and Michael who shoulder nuch of the burden of race day coordination.
- Barb, Joyce and Kate who provide for us all in the canteen and kitchen
- Michael and Ron who take the race entries and look after all money matters
- Paul, Lou, Ian, Stuart, Harry, Mike, Bob, Mark, Simon, Lyndall, Don and the many helpers and parents who look after the timekeeping and recording
- Mark who does the handicapping and runs the coaching sessions
- Ray who mans the camera, shows the results after the race and forwards me photos for the newsletter
- Gordon, Peter, Lloyd, Fran, Elke and Michael who form the backbone of our judging panel and who are on deck nearly every week

My apologies to anyone I have missed. There are so many people who make our club tick.

Thank you one and all for making this year such a successful one. I look forward to returning next year and helping us become an even bigger and better club.

TREASURER'S REPORT 01/10/2006 - 30/09/2007

Welcome to my eighth and final report as Treasurer of the VRWC Inc.

It has been an outstanding year for the club. On the revenue side, subscriptions have shown a modest increase. Race Fees have shown astronomical growth. At an average of \$5 a fee, the \$1610 increase over last year means an extra 322 competitors more than last year, with this year's total being approximately 1400. If this trend remains the same or increases, I envisage that the club will not experience any financial problems in the immediate future.

Other revenues included a refund on a faulty stop clock (\$770.00) and a grant from Parks Victoria of \$3000 toward a new stop clock. Hopefully this will serve the club for years to come.

The Canteen made a profit of \$1325, more than double last year. It is a brilliant result considering the season was a bit shorter than previous. The result is due to the great work of the ladies in the Canteen. The healthy bank balance in the Canteen Account means that the club is able to buy much needed equipment like stop clocks etc. Very little food is thrown out or wasted. The buying policies in the canteen are excellent.

As far as the expenses go, some expenses balance out against corresponding revenue items. The club is very fortunate in that many of the administration items-gas, telephone, Audit fee, stationery, photocopier supplies, and our rental and affiliations have remained the same over the years.

I wish to thank all those who have helped me in some way over my term of eight years as Treasurer. Having served the club in this capacity has been one of the greatest privileges of my life. I wish my successor all the best in the coming year.
