With continuing support from Parks Victoria, your membership and our canteen,we have been able continue to upgrade our facilities.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Once again this year our membership grew, this time to an all time high of 210. Of our current 210 members, 59 were new this year and the majority of these were in our younger age groups. In fact, 67 of our current members are aged 12 or younger. This does have implications for us as a club and we must continue to look for ways to make our club an ever more attractive proposition for our young walkers.

Much of this increase is due to the work of the many coaches, both suburban and country, who bring new blood into our sport and who then point their aspiring walkers to our club. The following figures shows the upward membership trend over the last 9 years:

A number of our members are country based walkers who join us as a 'second claim' walking club and compete with us when they can. But the majority of our members continue to be Melbourne based and many turn up nearly every week all season to enjoy the keen racing and fine social atmosphere in the club.

Our race fields were the largest ever this winter and we averaged 80 walkers per week (last winter, we averaged 70 per week). Some years ago, 80 would have been a very large raceday field. This winter, it was our average over the 19 Albert Park race days. I am pleased to say that our many officials handled the increased numbers well and racedays were on time and ran smoothly.

With the continuing strong income from large membership subscriptions and steady racing fees, the club was able to feed back significant amounts of money into its facilities and members. Amongst the many benefits delivered were

- \$500 grant to Tom Barnes who competed at the 2009 World University Games
- \$1255 distributed to members via the Club Teams Fund
- \$600 distributed to members via the Merrifield Award
- Some \$2400 in trophies and prizes (4 prize days were held during the winter season on each day, the designated winners were able to choose from prize pools in the vicinity of \$200 and the annual presentation day was held at the end of the winter season).

Our athlete recognition program was enhanced significantly this year when Neil Ryan, the proprietor of Runners World Kew, agreed to sponsor our top winter season walkers with major awards. The inaugural winners were

Neil has very generously agreed to continue the sponsorship this summer with similar awards to our overall top male and female walkers.

Once again, our winter season was delayed due to the March scheduling of the Australian Motor Racing Grand Prix. This year our first Albert Park races could not be scheduled until Sunday 25 April and in 2010 we do not expect to start racing at our Albert Park headquarters until the same time or later. We have learnt to live with this intrusion into our yearly calendar but the winter and summer seasons both remain shorter than they used to be and this does have an impact on our finances and on the overall enjoyment of our walkers.

We were further inconvenienced this winter due to long but understandable delays in fixing a broken Golf Driving Range fence. This meant we were forced to use alternate courses for the first half of the winter season, with some impact on our large walking fields.

I would like to acknowledge the Middle Park Bowling Club who are very supportive landlords. Their facilities are top knotch and give us a headquarters which is the envy of other clubs. I would also like to acknowledge Parks Victoria who allow us to use the service roads around Middle Park for our races. Like the Bowling Club, the Albert Park rangers are uniformly supportive and value us as park users.

We were lucky enough to be awarded an equipment grant this year from Parks Victoria and were able to invest in new club signage, new tent sides and new brochure holders. The total value of the grant was \$3129.

As usual, VRWC hosted a large number of championships at Albert Park. These included

- Three of the four days of the 2009 Athletics Victoria roadwalking championships (June-August 2009)
- The 2009 Athletics Victoria Schools roadwalking championships (June 2009)
- The 2009 Victorian Masters Association roadwalking championships (May and June 2009)
- Our own VRWC club championships (five sets in all)

We also ran the 2009 Victorian Masters 5000m track championships for VMA in March 2009 and helped Athletics Australia run the Australian 50 km roadwalking championship in December and the Australian 20 km roadwalking championships in March 2009 at Fawkner Park, providing equipment and manpower on both occasions.

This ongoing club support ensures that Victoria is the State of choice for major championships and gives our Victorian athletes ongoing access to major events.

We donated all takings from the RWA Interstate Challenge race day (11 July 2009) to Brain Tumour Research. What with race fees and donations and a top-up from the club, \$600 was forwarded to the Royal Melbourne Hospital Neuroscience Foundation. This fund raising initiative has now become a regular fixture item.

VRWC participated in both major Racewalking Australia Carnivals this year. In June, 82 walkers travelled to Canberra for the biggest ever Lake Burley Griffin Carnival, with many of the walkers participating in more than one event to help the club in the teams competitions. Overall, we were the dominant club, winning 9 individual golds and 5 team golds. We then sent a small team in late August to compete at the Second Federation event in Sydney which was held with the Australian roadwalking championships.

A number of our long serving members were acknowledged by Racewalking Australia at the inaugural RWA Merit Awards ceremony in June 2009. Congratulations to the following:

Our Masters walkers led by example with a number performing excellently at the World Masters Games in Finland in August. Golds were won by Andrew Jamieson, Stuart Kollmorgen and Liz Feldman and they were ably backed up by a strong VRWC contingent of minor medallists.

We are also privileged to have as club members many of Australia's current top walkers, including open walkers Nathan Deakes, Jared Tallent, Chris Erickson, Tom Barnes, Duane Cousins, Kellie Wapshott, Jess Rothwell and Megan Szirom and junior walkers Regan Lamble, Beth Alexander, Rachel Tallent and Rhydian Cowley.

Jess, Jared and Chris were all selected to compete in the IAAF World Championships in August and Tom was selected to compete in the World University Games in July.

These elite club members are backed up by a large pool of talented youngsters who will hopefully provide the next generation of champions. Our challenge is to provide a nurturing environment in which they can continue to develop and hone their walking skills until they are ready to take over the mantle.

And, of course, there are the many club members who race for the love of the sport and to maintain their health and well being in a constructive and enjoyable way. All are vitally important to the club.

Communication continues to be one of our strongest assets. Once again this year, the Heel & Toe newsletter was published 52 times in 52 weeks! With Terry Swan and Stuart Cooper providing photographs and with a number of other people providing ongoing input, the newsletter was circulated to a distribution list of around 300 email addresses. Stuart Cooper also fed our results to the Press each week and it was great to see the Monday morning stats in the newspapers.

This year with help from Terry Swan, we setup a Photo Gallery on our VRWC website to host photos from our weekly races. This has proven very popular with our members and forms part of our ongoing online archive which gets bigger each year.

It takes many people working together to run a successful club like ours. It is always difficult to single out particular people but I would like to mention

- Harry, Bob, Mark and Ron who shoulder much of the burden of race day coordination with me

- Peter who fulfils the role as VRWC Chief Judge and is on deck every week to coordinate and oversee this vitally important task.
- Barb, Joyce and Kate who provide for us all in the canteen and kitchen
- Paul, Lou, Ian, Stuart, Harry, Bob, Ian, Don, Matt, Ross, Michael and Peter and the many helpers and parents who look after the timekeeping and recording and equipment setup and pulldown

- Ray who mans the video camera on racedays and produces his excellent video compilations for viewing the following week (they just keep getting better each year)

43rd AFRWC WALKING CHAMPS, WESTON PARK, CANBERRA, 7 JUNE 2009

A record 397 entries by 297 competitors meant that the previous year's record attendance was well and truly shattered, making this year's Canberra carnival the biggest walking carnival ever held in Australia. While conditions were perfect for the 20 mile and 10 mile events, intermittent showers later in the day meant that some of the events for the younger walkers were raced in trying conditions - but nothing dampened what was a huge carnival.

VRWC sent its biggest team ever (82 walkers) but this was matched by NSWRWC which also sent 82 walkers. Strong teams from QLD and SA made for some very competitive events and smaller teams from Tasmania, ACT, Bendigo, WA and Regal walkers meant that we had a truly Australian wide carnival.

There were many great performances and many PBs. While it is not possible to mention everyone, I will specially acknowledge the many club members who competed in more than 1 event, thus giving us maximum chance of success in the teams competitions. All deserve special congratulations – none more so than Sam Candotti who actually competed in 3 events!

VICTORIAN RACE WALKING CLUB INC - TREASURER'S REPORT FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR 1st October 2008 – 30th September 2009

Again, another financially sound year for the Club. Membership numbers and, consequently, race fees have shown modest increases. I would like to acknowledge the continued valuable and reliable service provided by Ron Miller in recording race entries and collecting payments.

This year, as there were sufficient funds in our trading accounts to cover operating costs, and we have a predictable cash flow, the Committee has again decided to reinvest all interest earned on our three term deposits; unfortunately without the high term-deposit interest rates of the previous two years.

The timely efforts of our secretary, Tim Erickson, to ensure that submissions for potential grants and reimbursements are initiated and vigorously followed through has helped us to enjoy another year without the need to increase membership subscriptions or race fees.

The surplus of receipts over expenditure in our operating accounts of \$3,516 is significantly more than last year [\$1,825], even though we have reinvested the interest from our term deposits rather than bring it into our operating accounts. In fact, the Club has improved its financial position this year by \$13,000 [Surplus of \$3,500 + Interest Earned of \$9,500].

The unstinting efforts of our canteen ladies, Joyce, Barbara and Kate, have helped us to provide: a very valued service to our race-day participants; to return a good profit on canteen and catering operations of \$954, (excluding \$800 transferred from the General Account to cover expenditure on the previous year's RWA Carnival catering); and, to enhance our reputation as a welcoming and supportive club.

Next year is likely to see interest earned on term deposits of approximately \$6,000; that is, about two thirds of this year's earnings. This is will adversely affect the amounts available for Club grants and other monetary awards. We are also likely to incur considerable expenditure in restocking our uniform inventory.

The Club's financial position is sound. Our reserve, primarily in the form of a term deposit of some \$76,000 is considered to be necessary to allow for improvements to the existing clubrooms (eg, air-conditioning) and other expenditures that are contingent on the availability of suitable race courses and, possibly, accommodation. Uncertainty is heightened by the unknowns associated with the move of the main athletics venue from Olympic Park to Albert Park.
