Last winter season saw a smaller number of competitors racing, partly due to many Masters resting following their hectic year training for and racing at World Masters, combined with so many of our top walkers, both senior and junior, competing overseas.

Your committee, however, had a big year bringing new ideas to improve and streamline the conduct of races to cope with the increase in numbers which has occurred in recent years.

Next winter will see some changes to the way your club functions and I would like to invite all competitors and parents to become proactive and observe and comment on how your club functions, both in processing entries in the clubrooms and outside in the setting up and conduct of races.

I would like to thank the committee for their support and hard work over the last 12 months, the officials and judges for the long hours they put in, and especially those parents, competitors and friends who hop in and assist with the many tasks required to give the athletes an enjoyable days racing. A big thanks to Marlaine, Kate, Wendy and Barbara for their work both in providing nourishment and raising funds in the canteen.

Congratulations to all our members who raced with distinction overseas and at State level.

On behalf of everyone associated with this great club I say a special thanks to our Secretary, Tim Erickson, for the untold hours and commitment he gives to this club, to Racewalk Australia, the Centurions and to walking in general.

When Harry summers decided to retire last year, having given the club such great leadership for 29 years, I agreed to step in for a short term until a younger person was ready to take up the Presidency. I am hopeful that the transition can take place with this year's Annual General Meeting.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

2013/2014 was another successful and busy year for the club.

First let's get the negatives out of the way. From a membership perspective, our membership dropped from 188 to 158. While this still leaves us much larger than any other specialist walking club in Australia, it is a significant numerical reduction, especially considering the fact that we have hovered around the 200 mark consistently since 2008. This had implications, both from a financial perspective and from a participation perspective. In the 2013 winter season, we averaged 68 walkers per week over the 19 weeks of the winter season with a high of 100 (on 4th May). This winter season just finished, we averaged 51 walkers per week with a high of 69 (on 28th June).

Time will tell whether this is a once off aberration or whether it is part of a more general trend. The challenge for us all next year will be to make our club as attractive as possible to our current members and as welcoming as possible to prospective new members.

And now to the many positives on which I am pleased to be able to report. Let me start first of all with the various activities we have undertaken over the year.

As usual, VRWC hosted a large number of championships at Albert Park. These included

- All 5 days of the 2014 Athletics Victoria roadwalking championships (May-September 2014)
- The 2014 Athletics Victoria Schools roadwalking championships (June 2014)
- The 2014 Victorian Masters Association roadwalking championships (June and August 2014)
- The 2014 Australian Masters Association 20km roadwalking championships (June 2014)
- Our own VRWC club championships (five sets in all).

We hosted a second annual 24 Hour Carnival for the Australian Centurions at the end of this year's winter season. Like 2013, it was a big logistics exercise involving many helpers and officials but it all went off well and, from our perspective, it was cost neutral.

We also hosted the Victorian Masters 5000m track championships in March 2014, helped Athletics Australia run the Australian 50 km roadwalk championship in December 2013 at Fawkner Park and ran the Australian Masters 10km roadwalks in Geelong in December 2013, providing equipment and manpower on all 3 occasions.

We generally charge these other organizations for helping to run their championships and our income this year was enhanced by the following payments

- AV payment of \$675 for hosting the AV roadwalk championships
- AV payment of \$600 for running the AMA roadwalking championships in Geelong
- AA payment of \$200 for helping them run the AA 50km championship

Even with these additional income streams, our overall income was significantly less than last year but we still managed to push as much as we could back to our members, a grand total of around \$4000, split between Club Teams Fund refunds, Merrifield Award monetary prizes and around \$3000 spent on trophies, medals and prizes (5 prize days were held during the winter season with prize pools in the vicinity of \$250 and the annual presentation day was held at the end of the winter season)

We also spent a once off \$460 in having our championship walks course AIMS certified. We had our normal club course AIMS certified last year so this second task completes the process. This now means that any record breaking performances automatically have that box ticked.

Finally, we donated all takings from the RWA Interstate Challenge race day (12 July 2014) to the Country Women's Association of Victoria. What with race fees and donations and a top-up from the club, \$400 was forwarded to the organization.

Neil Ryan, the proprietor of Runners World Kew, continued with his generous sponsorship of our summer and winter seasons, with major awards totalling \$5000! We are so grateful to Neil for his ongoing support.

We continued to enhance our RFID Chip Timing System with the purchase of further chips, software and hardware. Ralph Bennett and Terry Swan continue to run with this challenging new technology and we are already seeing the benefits.

VRWC participated in the various Racewalking Australia Carnivals this year as part of RWV. In June, 56 Victorian walkers travelled to Canberra for the Lake Burley Griffin Carnival, with many of the walkers participating in more than one event to help in the teams competitions. Their efforts in winning a whole swag of individual and team medals ensured we went to an interim lead in the RWA Brennen Shield. RWV then won the RWA Postal Challenge in July and went on to win the Brennen Shield overall. Thus we can once again all bask in the reflected glory that we are the top Australian racewalking club.

Communication continues to be one of our strongest assets. This year, the Heel & Toe newsletter was published 53 times to a distribution list of some 400 email addresses. Terry Swan ably wielded the camera as our official club photographer, adding large numbers of photos weekly to our online gallery. Stuart Cooper fed our weekly results to the Press and ran our Facebook page for internal club communication. What a team!

Our Club Records continued to take a hammering this year with 59 new ones set. Our most prolific record breakers were Jemima Montag (19), Jesse Osborne (10) and Nikola Mandic (6). Certificates, designed by Emily Swan, were presented to every record breaker and the current list of club record holders is maintained on our website.

Our Masters walkers also led by example. The main trend setter was Kelly Ruddick whose onslaught on the W40 World Records continues unabated. Other Masters walkers to set new club records this year included David Smyth (M40) and Liz Feldman (W65).

The club boasted a whole swag of Australian Champions during the last 12 months

TREASURER'S REPORT FINANCIAL YEAR - 1 October 2013 - 30 September 2014

The period October 2013 to September 2014 was a quieter financial year for the Club. We finished the year with a loss of \$3,400, leading to a decline in Club assets to \$156,700.

Membership numbers and attendant race fees remained reasonably high but not as healthy as the previous three years.

Our return on investments in the form of bank term deposits has continued to decline in line with the general downturn in 'risk-free' investment interest rates.

When this year's expenses are compared to last year, it should be noted that the rent, or lease, with the Middle Park Bowling Club has yet to be fully paid, with \$1,300 outstanding. This year includes the first full year's depreciation expense of \$2,685 for our new race chip timing system.

Our intention, once we are fully familiar with the operation of the timing system, is to make the system available to other athletics organisations for a moderate fee to help us to recoup some of the system costs.

The new honorarium for a Timing System Coordinator was not allocated last year.

I acknowledge the valuable services of Mark Donahoo, Harry Summers, Ian Laurie, the Elms boys, Michael Bodey, Russ Dickenson, Stu Cooper, and others who have helped with the recording of race entries, the collection of fees, and race timing (big thanks also to Terry Swan for help with the timing system). Our canteen ladies, Barbara, Kate, and Wendy - and Marlaine when she is not too busy on other duties - have continued to provide a welcoming and very valued service to our race-day participants. Heather Carr, with Marlaine's assistance, has been a stalwart with the uniforms.

In summary, the Club's financial position remains sound, if slightly depleted.

The accompanying statements of accounts have not been audited.
