PRESIDENT'S REPORT

We've come to the end of another year, in which, if our numbers on the road were somewhat down, the commitment of those who did toe the starting line each week was not. The Club again provided comprehensive racing programs over the summer and winter, supporting these with a hard-working group of officials and helpers. Behind the scenes, your Club committee met each month to ensure the communications flowed, the letters were answered, bills were paid, medals were there to present and preparations for races and carnivals were finalized on time.

It was a year in which our sport again proved the catalyst for controversy, both within athletics and within the sport of walking itself. Indeed, to the outsider, it must have looked as if race walking was seeking to tear itself apart. Less than twelve months after the Rio Olympics staged arguably the most suspenseful and engrossing endurance contest of the Games – the men's 50km walk – the IAAF race walking committee itself launched a serious attempt to eliminate this event from future international competition and replace it with a half-marathon distance walk – and a track relay! A strong counter-campaign saw the reversal of this proposal, at least for now. But any sttempt to abolish an event with the 50km's history and heritage has to be a concern, and we have to be both vigilant and prepared for a long campaign for justice at international level as the attacks on our sport increase.

The decision to admit the women's 50km into international events, even if seen by many as premature, is a positive step in that it presents a new element of race walking to the sporting world at large and another avenue in which women can excel. It's now for women (and men) to back this initiative with committed development programs to boost the numbers of women competitive at the highest level in this historic and demanding event. On a different matter, the requirement for all international races to use a 'pit lane' procedure for managing walkers on three red cards is contentious, yet worthy of at least a serious trial. Race walking can not afford to be resistant to any kind of change if it is to survive in a climate where sound bytes, digital freeze frames, factual inaccuracy, populist commentary and sheer pig-ignorance all combine to cast aspersions on the sport's validity, integrity and viability.

Internationally, the VRWC was represented again by Regan Lamble and Rhydian Cowley, this time at the IAAF World Championships in London. While their placings may not have pleased them, they nevertheless acquitted themselves well under the circumstances. Our Kiwi member Quentin Rew set a NZ record in finishing a strong 12th in the 50km. (Injury, alas, prevented Jared Tallent from taking his place in the 50km and continuing his run of podium finishes.) Sadly, we bid farewell to Chris Erickson who announced his retirement after many years of top-echelon racing, including three Olympic teams and a top-10 finish in Rio. Thanks, Chris – you've been a fine ambassador for the sport, your country and the Club. We wish you all the best for the future.

An unexpected bright light emerged as the Winter season progressed, in the person of Gwen Steed, who began cutting down World age-group records over 3km and 5km. Gwen, a consistent competitor for many years, has carried her condition and fitness into her 70s and is reaping the reward of recognition for her hard work and competitiveness.

Looking at the state of the Club today, it must be said that, yet again, the biggest challenge we face is to attract new members, and to arrest the loss of current ones. Racing fields were, on average, smaller than last year's, which in turn were small than those of the year before. Little Athletics – the one-time wellspring of new race walking talent – is generating fewer young walkers, and fewer in the Masters ranks are trying their hand. We still have a big deficiency amongst teenage walkers. How to address this? Is it a matter of coaching? Do we need to be more aggressive recruiters, educators, advocates of the sport? Should we face up to the reality that ours is a niche sport,

competing with a wider range of other sports that are more attractive for a number of reasons? All of these questions, and more, require answering if we are to make any headway in re-stocking our member lists.

It has been recognized by the committee that (possibly due in part to declining membership) there is something of a lack in social atmosphere at the Club. It's been many years since the VRWC had a full-on social function, one that is independent of race day presentations. We are endeavouring to address this by organizing some such events for the future, starting with a Trivia Quiz night early in the 2018 Winter season. This is an exciting prospect which, hopefully, will be supported and widely promoted by Club members.

Once again, I want to express my appreciation of the efforts of our dedicated Club workers and officials, whose love of the sport and of the Club made itself so evident throughout the year: Terry Swan (Secretary), Karyn O'Neill (Treasurer), and Committee members Peter Vysma, Mark Donahoo, Bob Gardiner, Harry Summers, Heather Carr, Terry O'Neill and Michael Bodey; canteen workers Kate Suich, Wendy Cooper, Barb Gardiner, Eija Heikkila and Donna-Marie Elms; the judges, Peter (coordinator), Gordon Loughnan, Mark O'Mahoney, Shane Dickson, Diane Lowden, Fran Attard and Brenda Felton. On-course helpers and timekeepers, Ralph Bennett, Ian Laurie, Allan and Michelle Walmsley, Simon Baker, John Morrison, Damien Elms, Kathy Huse, Gerard and Madeleine Feain. And everyone else who, regularly or occasionally, did whatever they could to help us run a successful program.

Mark Donahoo – handicapper/registrar/race program coordinator and race director – again put in the hard yards to ensure our fixtures, all entries, results and race recording were up to standard each race day. Tim Erickson, now content with his ex-Committee role, continues to publish a first-rate weekly newsletter (Heel & Toe Online) with a world-wide circulation, as well as being our archivist, statistician, general repository of all race-walking knowledge and an indispensable race day worker. Peter Vysma was again invaluable in setting up the judges' requisites each week, providing transport for our equipment, acting as our AV delegate and generally keeping the essentials happening behind the scenes.

We have dedicated personnel at the VRWC that many clubs would envy. It now remains to bring into the Club more athletes who would benefit from this dedication, enjoy each others' camaraderie and go on to realize their goals.
