#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The VRWC's first full year of competition since 2019 contained much to celebrate, as well as much to ponder with regard to the future. We need to reflect on how best to attract and retain members at a time of considerable societal change. This need saw us reach out to the membership via an online survey in December. The survey attracted 40 responses. These have yet to be fully analysed (owing to a technical hitch which, hopefully, will be resolved soon), but from those we have seen they will assist us in bringing about necessary change whilst keeping hold of what is valued.

The chief concern at present is rebuilding our membership. Although we saw a small number of new walkers join at the start of the Winter season, this was offset by the departure or reduced activity of some of our older members.

One cause of this seems to be lack of knowledge of the sport itself, and of the VRWC in particular. This is compounded by the negativity expressed by elements in the media and even within the wider world of athletics. We continue with our efforts to publicise and promote the Club and the sport, with contacts being sought among the Little Athletics centres in particular. A Google communication group has been set up for this purpose and has already attracted interest from a number of centres including country groups.

Efforts to attract interest amongst the wider public continue, through leafleting, community noticeboards etc. Several of our parents undertook leafleting at AVSL and at other meetings on the Club's behalf. The committee remains open to constructive ideas from all quarters as to how best to inform the public in the benefits of race walking and promote the VRWC as the prime platform for their enjoyment of it and as a means of aiming for the top. For this to happen, every member and follower of race walking needs to become an advocate of the sport and of the club, promoting the benefits of both as widely as possible.

Four of our younger members – Will Thompson, Alanna Peart, Marcus Wakim and Fraser Saunder – wore green and gold for the first time overseas, and we congratulate them on their achievement. In all, nine VRWC members represented Australia in 2022 – an outcome that must be unique among small clubs anywhere. Jemima Montag's 4<sup>th</sup> in Oregon and successful Commonwealth title defence were the best results. Nearly all of these walkers came up through Little Athletics and VRWC racing programs, which is something both to celebrate and to build upon.

The Winter races attracted an average of 30 entrants per week. The most popular race distances across all ages were between 3kms and 8kms. Races of 10km and further attracted fewer entries. Worryingly, the AV 20km and 30km championships had no entrants (although our elite walkers' overseas commitments partly accounted for this), and the Ray Smith Trophy went unclaimed. Do we have any longer members who want to race over 30km? Can the club expect officials and judges to attend for an event that attracts no member interest? A decision needs to be made as to whether to continue with the 30km, upgrade it to 35km (perhaps promoting it as a WA qualifier?) or dispense with races within that range altogether.

One of the aims of the online survey was to determine whether or not our racing programs still meet the needs of current and prospective members. While responses so far indicate majority support for maintaining the current arrangements, some desire for change is also evident. Suggestions have included different venues and racing times, perhaps with an injection of novelty (such as non-standard distances, a second relay or intervals day etc), as well as a winter Club track championship.

Summer weeknight racing was poorly supported this season. A review is underway to ascertain the reasons for this and the feasibility of continuing with it.

In March, the organisers of 'Run The Tan 2022' approached us regarding a new 'Elite Walkers' component, with the first three males and females to receive a share of the prize money on offer. The opportunity to showcase the country's best walkers to a live and televised audience was too alluring to pass up. Unfortunately, doubts regarding whether fairness of technique could be ensured on the 3.8km Tan loop were confirmed – the four judges in attendance were insufficient to oversee proper adherence to the walking rules in a situation where competition for cash worked against it. It was decided, therefore, to decline an invitation to the 2023 edition (although VRWC members are still free to participate as general members of the public.)

Sunday 11 September saw the Club celebrate its centenary – after a 12-month delay – in conjunction with the Australian road walking championships. As many 'old timers' and past members as possible were contacted (former Olympians received special invitations) and help was sought amongst the membership in reaching out. While advanced age, poor health and prior commitments accounted for a number of absences, 156 did attend to share lunch and reminiscences, as well as to peruse the wealth of Club memorabilia on display. Many thanks to the Centenary subcommittee (Karyn O'Neill, Heather Carr, Michael Bodey, Donna-Lee Elms, Tim Erickson), also to Wendy Cooper and Tony Doran for their help on the day. Our thanks also to Margaret Hay (what a

cake!), Lachlan McDonald (MinuteMan Press) for the mug and flask printing, and Francesca Fitzgerald and her staff at *Muse-Events Catering*.

Finally, my thanks as always to those whose efforts kept the Club's activities going –
