PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The VRWC's activities for 2022-23 took place amid a year of upheaval on the international scene. As a consequence, there are ramifications for domestic competitions worldwide, and Australia is no exception.

The decision by World Athletics and the IOC to replace the planned 35km Mixed teams race with a Mixed Marathon Relay, in which no walker would walk appreciably further than 10km, has rendered distances beyond 20km irrelevant, at least internationally. Gone is any remaining opportunity for walkers geared more for endurance than pure speed to represent their countries, since the coming World Walking Teams Cup in Antalya (TUR) has already followed suit and many countries have also done away with their 35km championships. Meanwhile, Australia's walkers no longer have a December 35km championship as there is no longer any international competition to qualify for. Nor will club walkers, whose goals would extend little beyond triumphing over their own fatigue to finish the course (as in the good old days) have such an opportunity unless clubs make a point of putting on long races purely for this purpose, and hope someone turns up for them. (The 'last bastion', as it were, is the LBG 30km in Canberra, and long may it live.)

We'll get a fair idea in Antalya, then Paris, as to the viability (not to say credibility) of the new event. As for the VRWC, do we embrace the concept, perhaps putting on our own variation of a mixed relay walk (perhaps with shorter legs)? Or do we reject it out of hand and champion the longer distances which, it must be said, we've struggled to get starters for in recent years? There is much to ponder as 2024 rolls around.

The Club was, once again, well represented in overseas competition. A huge cause for celebration was Jemima Montag, who place 2nd in the WA World Championships 20km Road walk in 1:27.16, her first major international podium result. In addition, Declan Tingay got his first major top 10 finish with an 8th place in 1:18.30. Rhydian Cowley achieved his best international 20km result, coming 14th in 1:19.41. Rebecca Henderson, gearing up for the 35km five days later, was 33rd in 1:35.51, while Kyle Swan found the going tough but gave his all for 40th in 1:26.02.

Sadly, a severe back injury put paid to Bec's hopes of starting in the 35km she'd worked so hard for. Rhydian found the five-day turnaround inadequate for the regeneration of his reserves, walking himself literally into the ground when his legs gave out at 25, then 27km. Congratulations to our VRWC internationals. As ever, they made us proud. (Congratulations, also, to NSW's Allanah Pitcher, 21st in the 35km in her first major international.)

On the home front, the VRWC successful conducted its 2023 Winter program, with one major change from previous years. Following feedback provided in the Member Survey conducted in December, four non-competition days were scheduled in the Winter fixture, giving officials, judges and competitors a break from turning up each week. The response was mixed. While the 'days off' were appreciated by some, it was felt that the continuity and rhythm of the competitive season was disrupted, while the social interaction provided by meeting each week was diminished. Furthermore, the view held by many was that anyone who wanted a week off could simply take one, without others finding competition unavailable to them. One compromise solution is to have two competition-free weeks, each following a busy major championship weekend.

Race attendances illustrated once again the need to boost membership across the board, but particularly in the junior and adult male (20-50 year) age ranges. Clubs across the country – race walking and athletics in general – grapple unceasingly with this issue. Efforts to attract new members though leafleting, bulletin boards and word of mouth have led to enquiries from members of the public which are always responded to. Taking advantage of these expressions of interest when they occur is essential, and we are endeavouring to promote the sport and the club to the full on such occasions.

With Masters participation in athletics in general decline, the future lies in the attraction and development of newcomers at Little Athletics level. Currently we have a keen but small cohort of U10-U18 walkers whose ongoing engagement would be greatly enhanced by their having more age peers to provide competitive racing and social engagement. We are liaising with Little Athletics Victoria through their CEO, Nathan McConchie, with the aim of promoting the sport around the centres and, ultimately, inaugurating a LAVic Winter road walking championship – something other states have had for years. Club coach Mark Donahoo has made himself available for clinics at various centres. Meanwhile, an education session was held for the first time for Centre reps on the theme 'How to put on a race walking event'. While sparsely attended owing to communication issues, the session was well received and it is hoped to run similar sessions for the benefit of LAVic personnel in the future.

Efforts to attract more interest in taking up race judging continue. International judge Zoe Eastwood-Bryson (SA) conducted two seminars during the year, while our current panel has managed, for the most part, to hold onto its numbers. However, the inevitable losses due to increased age and other factors have to be redressed, if provision in this indispensable element of the sport is to continue satisfactorily.

In May, the Club was the beneficiary of a generous financial bequest from the late Gladys Gleeson, widow of club distance walking legend Jim Gleeson. It is felt that the bequest should be put to work for the direct benefit of the members, one idea being to give the clubrooms a much-needed facelift. The Middle Park Bowling Club has sourced new blinds to replace the old, tatty curtains, and they have offered us new carpets that are surplus to their requirements.

A successful working bee in July finally cleared valuable space in the rooms, laundry and in the storage shed, which one had often taken life and limb into one's hands entering. The relocated shelving and plywood paneling has markedly increased the facility of the shed and enabled the installation of a washing machine in the laundry.

In closing, I wish to thank all those who have contributed in whatever way to the successful running of the Club and its activities, to the benefit of its members. (See the list below for all those whose names we had down as race-day officials. My apologies if you went unnoticed ... be assured your contribution didn't.)

In particular, my thanks to Club secretary Terry Swan, whose unceasing efforts have seen, amongst other things, the installation of a modernized online Membership and Race entry portal, along the lines of that employed by Athletics Victoria. Thanks also to our Committee members, including Treasurer Karyn O'Neill, handicapper and race secretary/manager Mark Donahoo and Life members Bob Gardiner and Tim Erickson for their race-day efforts and problem-solving expertise.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

In 2023 we migrated our club database to the Revolutionise Sports Platform, the learning curve was steep, but as a committee we felt it was time to use a product that most were already familiar with and a system that provide multi user input and a common administration platform, whilst it was a new cost to the club, we felt the benefits far outweighed the cost. Unfortunatley, Aths Vic would not allow us to integrate our requirements into the existing AV system, this meant our memerbship base had to register in two systems, not ideal, but worth it.

The working bee was a tremendous help and well attended, we are lucky to have so many will to chip in, even if it was for 15 minutes, it all helped.

The new membership system also presents us with various statistics and reports, and we discuss these items at our committee meetings, for example we have 90 competing members, but can never get more that 42 athletes to the start line, 44 being the largest field this season.
