PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The year 2023-24 was, once again, a cocktail of achievements and optimism, leavened with a few of the usual challenges that keep us focused on how to stay on top of the game and keep the VRWC in the strongest position possible to promote the sport of race walking, in Victoria and nationally.

Our cause was done no harm at all by the seven (yes, 7) members who earned the right to wear green and gold this year at several major international races. None is more major that the Olympic Games, at which the VRWC was represented by five of its top walkers thus:

Not only did Jemima and Rhydian bring home Olympic medals – they also ensured that Australia's race walkers maintained their record of having a medallist and/or top 10 finisher at every Olympics since Atlanta 1996, an achievement not matched in any other track & field event. Additionally, the five abovementioned extended the VRWC's proud boast of having Olympic reps at every Games since 1948!

The international calendar featured two other major meets – the World Team Walking championships in Antalya (TUR), and the WA U20 Track & Field championships in Lima (PER). Again, the VRWC was well represented:

Congratulations to Jemima, Rhydian, Bec, Kyle, Will, Riley and Marcus. The VRWC has long been a key player in developing young talent for the international stage, and this level of representation overseas – quite apart from placings and times – is something of which the Club can be proud and must strive to continue.

Another initiative that has helped boost the Club's profile this year is the listing of selected races for World Athletics Bronze certification. Such races are listed on the World Athletics calendar and results page. This was arranged by Terry Swan with the support of WA and Athletics Australia and provides an added incentive for walkers seeking qualifying times to participate in our racing programs. With Tokyo flying in the face of the WA and IOC establishment to hold the 35km at its World championships next year, Middle Park will again see a 35km qualifying and national championship meet which is certified Bronze by WA.

It's been clear for some time now that, in order to increase our member numbers, attention has to be focused on two main areas: the promotion of coach and judge education, and the boosting of interest in the sport at the junior level. To this end, work has commenced with Little Athletics Victoria to produce a standardised model of judge training across the state. Some regions have established judge training and assessment programs in place while others don't. It's a similar situation with coaching. The VRWC has a role to play in these areas that is acknowledged by LAVic, and the preliminary discussions have been encouraging. This year, prior to one of our winter races, a coaching and judging education session for parents was held alongside a practical coaching session led by Mark Donahoo. Mark has also been driving negotiations with Athletics Victoria to establish regular practical race walk coaching education at Level 2 and above, and we look forward to seeing this bearing fruit in 2025 and beyond.

An encouraging initiative this winter was the first-ever LAVic Road walking championships in June, which to our delight attracted 85 starters from 102 entrants. Despite some teething problems, the meet was a great success and will be presented again next year. The challenge will be to harvest new VRWC members from the interest and attendees of such races.

The other high-attendance event was the RWA Road championships, held on our 1km Aughtie Drive loop in August. This attracted over 100 entries from all states except WA, and was again highly successful. Unless another state puts its hand up, we will probably hold it again in 2025 if it goes ahead. Certainly we seem the be the club best equipped to do so.

On the negative side, there were two competition disappointments that should be noted. One was the negligible attendance of Victorian walkers at this year's Lake Burley Carnival (ACT) in June. Only in the Men's 15km was the VRWC able to field a team – a disheartening outcome considering the pitched battles we used to have with NSW and SA in particular in our quest for the Brennen Shield. The ACTRFWC, who host the event yearly, are prepared to do so for one more year in the hope of better attendance. Let's get behind it in 2025, for it's a great weekend and a wonderful means of team bonding.

The other disappointment is what seems to be the end of the AV Country road championships. For the past two years Ballarat RWC have kept this event on life support but this year the lack of interest could not be ignored, despite the VRWC hosting the event on behalf of country walkers. We are unlikely to host a 2025 edition unless there is a sharp turnaround in enthusiasm and commitment. Over to you, country walkers.

Following the experiment of the 'four weekends off' last year, the 2024 winter season resumed its weekly competition format. The Club points races attracted fields of around 25 to 35 most weeks, usually with a boost in numbers on championship days. In all, we finished the season with around 80+ members in total, including fee-paying, Life members and regular officials. It's hoped that, with continued publicity of the sport at Little Aths level and in the community at large, these numbers will grow.

2024 will close with a bang on Sunday 15 December, with the Australian 35km championship at Middle Park – another WA World Bronze event. The success of Will Thompson in Takahata, Japan in October (2nd fastest 35km by an Australian) will add more spice to this event, and we look forward to it.

In closing, I would like to acknowledge the work and input of members, families and supporters whose efforts proved indispensable throughout the year, including Terry Swan (Club secretary and AA, AV and World Athletics liaison), Mark Donahoo (Vice-president, competition manager, handicapper and Club coach), Karyn O'Neill (Treasurer), our general committee including Terry O'Neill, Heather Carr, Donna-Marie Elms, Michael Bodey and Peter Vysma, as well as long-serving Life members Bob Gardiner and Tim Erickson. Many of us have been around now for decades and, while we still want to contribute to the VRWC, new blood and fresh ideas are not only welcome but necessary for the long-term success of this historic club.

Race days would have been far harder to run successfully without the regular input of Ian Laurie, Bill Carr, Alla Pashutina, Dylan Shuttleworth and Margaret Hay on the officials' table. Nor would there be any racing at all without our walk judges – take a bow, Gordon Loughnan, Di Lowden, Brenda Felton, Michael Bodey, David Cash, Terry O'Neill, Tony Doran, Scott Nelson, Shane Dickson and Kathleen Marsh. Donna-Marie and Gwen Steed kept the canteen running for those welcome cuppas on cold winter weekends – thanks, ladies!

It's been a year of exciting events and new initiatives for the VRWC. We look forward to building on what we've begun in 2025 and seeing a growing, committed membership as the outcome.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Our membership remans healthy at at 80 members, a few down on last year, and lots of new faces. Race day participation is fair, but we don't see the numbers of years gone by, our biggest races day in terms of numbers was around 44 athletes, on average we get around the mid 20's. Our season ticket system is working well and encourages members to participate more often and for less money. We would love to see more participation on race days.

Thanks to Mark Donohoo and Stu Cooper for their drive and persistence with AV, AA and LAVIC to get some coaching courses relevant to our sport, they have both made huge inroads in getting Race Walking into the curriculum, these course should be available to all by 2025. Coaches are in short supply, as seen with Frances Attard, some of her squad travel over 1 hour to get to her sessions, such is the demand. We need coaches, we need courses and this will nuture the growth of our sport. Well done to Mark and Stu.

We have also managed to get most of our major races onto the World Stage, by having them recognised as World Events, Bronze Label. This simply means that our events can be used as qualification purposes and opents to anyone in the world to join us. We have seen good uptake from our northern friends in NSW and Qld to get some good races recorded. The added benefit is that VRWC results are now globally published on the World Athletics Calender, giving our athletes a world profile. Not all results are seen, as there are minimum standards required before they can be published.

We also hosted the inaugural LAVIC Road Walking Event, this was huge with over 100 Little Aths members from all over the state walking on our venue under our direction. This was well received by all, especially LAVIC and will now feature annually on their calender.

We also hosted the RWA 2nd Federation Carnival, the national federation event. Well supported by all states and over 100 athletes again.

Each week, a familiar group of volunteers setup the course, tables and tents and without this team, we couldn't hold our races, some times it seems we have more volunteers than competitors, and without then helping out, it would not be possible to hold our events. If you can help for just 5 minutes, it is invaluable, we thank everyone for their assistance.

Lastly, we wish a group of Judges success in their upcoming exams. VRWC was fortunate to be able to help nominate some of our judges to qualify under the World Atletics banner to become BRONZE level judges. This will mean VRWC has a great coverage of qualified judges, more than any other state in Australia.
