VICTORIAN WOMEN'S RACEWALKING CHAMPIONSHIPS: 1947 - 2023

I have already written about the long time that Australian women had to wait before they could compete officially in amateur athletics competition (see <u>Australasian Championships Women 1933-1940.pdf</u>).

In summary, the general attitude of the male-dominated society in Australia was not conducive to women's athletics and women were actively discouraged from participating in sport. Nevertheless, there was no stopping the women and by 1928 three women's clubs had affiliated with the NSWAAA as part of men's clubs - Botany, Kensington and St George. In 1929, women's inter-club competition began in Sydney.

South Australian, Queensland and Victorian women also formed their own associations around this time. But it was not always easy. Early in 1929 a delegate from Glenhuntly AAC in Victoria moved that women's events be included in the state championships. The male delegates were shocked and the motion was soundly defeated. The women went their own way, forming the Victorian Women's Amateur Athletic Association (VWAAA) in December 1929. When the women's association subsequently tried to affiliate with the men, they were refused on the grounds that they would flourish better on their own. This resulted in Victorian men and women competing in separate associations until the late 1970's when they were finally amalgamated. Nationally, the women also went their own way, forming the Australian Women's Amateur Athletic Union (AWAAA) in 1932 and taking control of their own destiny.

The 1930/31 season saw the start of inter-club for women in Victoria at 3 venues - Williamstown and Glenhuntly Cricket Grounds and the Royal Showgrounds. It was not until 1936 that the VWAAA was able to obtain Royal Park from the Melbourne City Council. By 1939 they had a proper cinder track and dressing room accommodation there and they competed at that venue until the merger with the men in the late 1970s.

Interestingly, the Victorian Women's Championships continued throughout the war, with their usual schedule of events, except for the 880 Yards Walk which had been removed. It would not reappear until the 1947 edition.

Finally in 1947, the women walkers were able to participate once again in the Victorian T&F Championship at Royal Park, with Elsie Capel the winner of the 880 yards event. As was the norm during those time, only the winner's time was recorded.

Sue Orr of Ringwood, born 1958, confirmed her early potential in November 1976 when she broke the Victorian Open 3,000m walk record in a sensational 13.54.4, only 4.8 seconds outside Anne Pembroke's Australian record. Within two months, on 8th January 1977, she clocked 6:35.1 to break the World 1500m walk record. In February 1977, Sue again lowered the Australian and World records to 6:29.4. She would dominate the Australian scene for many years to come.

By this stage, the two walks were contested over 3000m and 5000m.

By 1979, our top 3 Victorian walkers were Sue Cook, Lorraine Young and Sally Pierson. Sue and Lorraine were obvious, given their placings in various open championships up till then. But Sally Pierson had not really featured on the open medal tables, given that she was still only 16 at that time. But what a talented walker she was. In February 1978, she had set Australian and Victorian Under 15 and Under 16 3000m walk records at Aberfeldie with 14:13.2. This time stood as a Victorian record for over 20 years. She followed this up in Perth with wins in the 1979 Australian track Open and Junior championship double. She was amongst the youngest ever to win an Australian Open championship, just days short of her sixteenth birthday.

Sue, Sally and Lorraine were selected to represent Australia in the 1979 Eschborn Cup. They performed superbly, Sue finishing 5th in 23:10, Sally 10th in 24:10 and Lorraine 15th in 24:35. Australia finished 3rd in the women's team competition, confirming our position as one of the top women's walking nations

NSW walker Kerry Saxby, born 1961, had burst onto the national scene in 1983 with silver in the Australian 5000m walk championship. She would go on to win a record 27 National titles, set 32 World Best/Records in race walking and represent Australia in 24 major championships. By 1986, she was already at the top, as her Victorian 5000m Championship winning time of 21:53.36 indicates.

The other walker of note was a phenomenal underage walker from Geelong, Gabrielle Blythe. Gabrielle, born in 1989, had cut a swathe through the junior ranks, setting record after record and, by the time of these championships, had PBs of 6:20.2 (1500m) and 13:12.6 (3000m) and set a 5000m PB of 22:37.46 in this race. She would also spend 3 years as a scholarship holder at the AIS inc Canberra, from 1991 to 1993. It was during her time in Canberra that she would represent Australia in the 1992 Olympics.

With the Commonwealth Games to be contested in Melbourne in April 2006, the Victorian T&F Championships were swapped from Olympic Park to the Melbourne Cricket Ground. It was the first time that walkers had graced the hallowed turf since the 1956 Olympics and it saw the usual entry list swell from around 300 to over 1600, many from interstate. The 5000m walks had 28 and 30 entries in the men's and women's race respectively. After the Commonwealth Games, the MCG once again reverted to a football and cricket stadium so this was a wonderful once off occasion.

A new name appears in the document with this race, namely Jessica Rothwell, back in 8th place with 24:52. Jess, born in 1989 and hailing from a dairy farm in Katunga, in NE Victoria, was the top Australian U18 walker at that stage and was dipping her feet into Open competition for the first time. She would go on to have a stellar career, with 2 Race Walking World Cups, 1 World Junior Championship, 2 World Championships and 1 Commonwealth Games, before ongoing injuries put paid to her career in 2013.

She went on to take gold in the 2018 Commonwealth Games and 6th place in the 2020 Olympic Games, thus confirming has position as Victoria's greatest ever female walker.

Philippa Huse was also a first time name in the listing, with her 5th place finish in the 5000m walk. Philippa, born 1999, went to to represent Australia at the 2018 Race Walking World Cup and the 2019 World University Games.
