WALKER OF THE WEEK

My walker os the week this time around is 17 year old **Charlotte Hay**. Competing in the AVSL 5000m walk at Casey Fields last Saturday, she recorded a PB of **24:28.8**. It was only a week previously that she recorded a big PB of 24:42.22 in the Victorian Open 5000m walk and she has now taken a further 14 seconds off that time.

Charlotte has been walking since 2013, when she started in the U9 age group! 8 years later, she continues to go from strength to strength. Her major medal count reads as follows (with an impressive 4 golds in the annual LAVIC T&F Champs, from 2016 to 2019). Well done Charlotte! Lots more to come.

After some confusing information on the Fawkner Park Championship meet, Athletics Australia has confirmed that the carnival is indeed to be held on the morning of Saturday 27th March and that the rescheduled Australian 20km Championships will be held on this day also. AA has not yet published a timetable but, if it follows previous years, we can expect the 50km to be at 7AM, the 20km to be at 8AM, the 10km to be at 9AM and the 5km to be at 9:40AM. But this is still subject to confirmation.

Entry is via Athletics Australia (see https://www.athletics.com.au/events/83627/). Entries close on Monday 15th March. I believe that walkers who had entered the 20km meet in Adelaide will be contacted by AA this week to confirm if they want their entry rolled over. But if you haven't heard from them by later this week, then ring the AA office. As they say, the clock is ticking!

Athletics Australia has also confirmed that a further 20km race will be held at Middle Park in Melbourne on Sunday 2nd May. This has been scheduled to help walkers meet qualifying standards for 2021 international championships. All are welcome to enter. Further details will follow via Athletics Australia and VRWC.

AVSL ROUND 8, VARIOUS VENUES, SATURDAY 6 MARCH 2021

The 2020/2021 Athletics Victoria Shield competition continued last Saturday afternoon, with round 8 contested across a variety of venues. Numbers were down overall, with only 45 walkers in action. This is what we typically see when the 5000m walks are scheduled for the higher age groups. Club walkers vote withtheir feet and bypass the distance, which they perceive to be too far. I had been intending to walk in the 3000m walk at Casey Fields but lost my way and missed the race (how embarassing!)

Charlotte Hay led the walkers home in the 5000m at Casey Fields, with an impressive PB of 24:28.8 while Mark Blackwood led them home in the 2000m with an equally impressive 8:43.1. Jamie Mayhew-Sharp showed how much he is improving at the momentwith his big PB of 9:22.8, while Ariana Pashutina (still U14) continues to improve each week, recording a time of 9:49.1 on this occasion. And of course, our super Masters walkers Andrew Jamieson (M74 111:17.2) and Heather Carr (W71 12:00.3) impressed, as always!

ATHLETICS WALES ELITE WINTER 10,000 MEET, NEWPORT, WALES, SATURDAY 6 MARCH 2021

Last Saturday's Elite Only Winter 10km meet in Newport, Wales, featured 10,000m runs and walks to allow the top Welsh athletes to test themselves ahead of the upcoming summer season. **Callum Wilkinson** scored a dominant solo victory in the men's 10,000m track walk, breaking his own national record by nearly 50 seconds with a PB time of 39:05.85. Second place went to **Cameron Corbishley** with 42: 05.34, after 1 minute stop in the penalty area. **Heather Lewis** was unlucky to miss her Commonwealth Games qualification target of 46:00 because of a 60 second time penalty, but her time of 46:44.77 was still a PB. **Bethan Davies** may have been expected to challenge Heather but was disqualfied.

FROM THE VAULT



The above photo shows Australia's **Kerry Saxby-Junna** racing in the women's 10km walk at the 1987 IAAF World Athletics Championships in Rome. Kerry was the 10km walk world record holder at the time, with 42:52, and was expected to be in the medals. And she certainly was, taking silver. This was the first time that a women's 10km had been contested in the World Championships. This was also Kerry's first major international medal and, from then on, she was rarely out of the major placings in an international career that extended until 2001. She remains Australia's greatest ever female walker and still holds a number of our Australian records.
