** WALKER OF THE WEEK **

Last week's WOTW was a celebration of two things – unanswerable speed and a youthful plunge into the unknown waters of speed-endurance. This time around, it's about ultra-endurance in bitter, soaking conditions ... and three who came out on top.

While the top juniors in the land were vying for track title honours in hot, humid Brisbane, the ultra-walkers at Coburg track (and their 24hr running counterparts) were splashing through lap after freezing lap in search of various goals, including Centurion qualifiers. Of the latter group, Dutch journeyman campaigner **Arie Kandelaars** made good at his 4th attempt, becoming Australian Centurion C85. Meet director Tim Erickson's report on Arie's achievement follows:

"The third walker to reach the milestone was Dutchman Arie Kandelaars who became Australian Centurion C85, with a time of 23:28:07. It was Arie's fourth trip to Australia in search of our centurion badge after falling short of the required total in our 2018, 2019 and 2022 events. It was a case of returning to complete unfinished business. Arie already had 5 Centurion badges to his credit: African (2016, 23:52:00), English (2017, 23:49:27), NZ (2017, 23:36:29), Continental and USA (2018, 23:52:14). Five badges in quick succession and now finally an Australian Centurion badge for his sixth."

Joining Arie as 100 mile finishers are Centurion veterans **David Billett C50** (2nd in **23:08:12**, his 8th Australian 100 mile finish) and **Michelle Thompson C58** (1st in **22:16:55**, the seventh time she has achieved it.) Apart from a wealth of experience, each of the three had a plan that they executed effectively in the horrendous conditions, and each broke the 24 Hour barrier convincingly.

Congratulations, Arie, David and Michelle. Seldom has WOTW been so hard-earned, and your performances were a lesson in perseverance against the odds for all of us.

It was the Little Aths walkers' turn to shine at the weekend, with the U13 and U14 age groups from around the country doing battle over 1500m. Highlight of the meet was a sizzling win by **Sophie Polkinghorne** (NSW, pictured) in the Girls U13 in **6:21.41**, an astonishing result for one so young. The fact that no-one else in any category got close to Sophie's time indicates the level to which she has raised the bar.

For the Vics, it was a productive morning. **Jaime Hvalica** (U13, **6:54.74**) and **Max Davidson** (U14, **6:52.53**) both won gold, while **Daniel Pashutin** came home just 7 secs behind Max and well clear of the rest of the field for silver.

We hope to see as many of these youngsters as possible take to the road races this winter, to develop their condition and speed further for next summer.

HUNGARY: Hungarian Road walking C’ships - Bekescsaba

Racewalking’s favourite journeyman **Emmanuel Tardi** sends his latest report, this time from Hungary:

I was appointed as judge in Bekescsaba (200km to the south of Budapest) for the Hungarian racewalking national championship. The race took place in the middle of the city near a big commercial centre. Each loop was 1km long

on a very flat road with very large turning points. The start was at 9am. The temperature increased from 10° to 23° during the race.

In the men's 20km, **Mate Helebrandt** was the leader with **Norbert Toth** and **Bence Venyercsan**. After 2 laps, Mate stayed alone and easily won the race.

In the women's 20km, **Barbara Olah** was the initial leader, 50 meters in front of **Rita Recsei** and **Tiziana Spiller** who worked together and for the team title. They caught up Barbara after 4,5km, and they continued together. After 8k, Tiziana slow down and Rita won the race. Barbara did not finish.
