VRWC TRACK WALKS, DOLOMORE OVAL, MENTONE, SATURDAY 29 APRIL 2023

With Australian Motor Race Grand Prix cleanup still underway at Middle Park, we were forced to an alternate venue on Saturday for the opening round of our VRWC winter season. So it was down to the Dolamore Reserve at Mentone and back to the track for the Victorian 10,000m Track Championships, as well as a smattering of VRWC Club Championships.

INTERNATIONAL RACING NEWS

Gone are the days when you had to hunt around for major international results and then format them from a pdf or (even worse) a jpeg image. For some time now, World Athletics has been capturing all major meet results in its *Calendar & Results* section at https://worldathletics.org/competition/calendar-results? Just choose recent start and end date filters and click on Race Walking in the Discipline box and you will see all the latest meets. For instance, this filter will give you all the international racewalk results for the last month: https://worldathletics.org/competition/calendar-results?disciplineId=3&startDate=2023-04-01&endDate=2023-05-01

By way of additional info, all the walk results are put into the system by Hungarian racewalker and World Athletics Stats team member **Anette Torma**. Once verified and entered, they filter straight through to the World Athletics ranking system. It's a huge task that takes a lot of her time so huge thanks to Anette for this service to our walking community.

Over the past 2 weekends, we had no less than 5 World Athletics Race Walking Tour meets (2 Gold, one Silver and 2 Bronze), offering prize money and having international judging panels. Here they are:

Who said that racewalking had a shrinking footprint. The opposite is the case. The number of top walking competitions world wide continues to grow and our sport is as healthy as ever, even as we fight against anti-walking forces within the World Athletics and IOC hierarchies.

In last week's newsletter, Stu had links to the omarchador reports for the Olomouc and Mt SAC Relay walk results so I won't reproduce those again, but I will feature the most recent three results.

II GRAN PREMIO INTERNACIONAL FINETWORK MADRID MARCHA, MADRID (ESP), SUNDAY 30 APRIL 2023

Around 10,000 spectators lined Madrid's Gran Vía on Sunday to witness the 2nd edition of the Finetwork Madrid International Grand Prix, Cita de Campeones. It was a huge meet, with over 250 walkers spread across a variety of events. The meet boasted World Athletics Race Walking Tour Gold status.

For many of the European walkers, this was the perfect hitout before the European Walk Champs in Podebrady in 3 weeks time.

In the men's 10km roadwalk, Italian walker **Francesco Fortunato** won with 38:56, ahead of the Brazilian **Caio Bonfim** (39:03) and the Ecuadorian **David Hurtado** (39:06). "It's my first big win at an international level. Honestly, I didn't expect it. I did expect to finish on the podium but not win. When I had gone 8km, I saw myself with confidence and with the energy to be able to go faster", said Fortunato. "There were very strong rivals. It has been a very difficult race, at a very high level, and this victory gives me more confidence for the European Cup, the World Cups and the Paris 2024 Olympic Games". Pre-race favourite and defending champion **Perseus Karlstrom** was off the pace early and had to be content with 10th place and a time of 40:04. I wouldn't place too much emphasis on this result. He is sure to be in the mix in the big race.

In the women's 10km race, Chinese **Jiayu Yang**, the 2017 world champion, won with a time of 43:20, ahead of compatriot **Quanting Wu** (43:33) and the Mexican **Alegna González** (43:35).

The junior races also saw big fields, with 64 walkers in the U14 and U16 events, and 35 walkers in the U18 and U20 races.

2ND KORZENIOWSKI WARSAW RACE WALKING CUP, WARSAW (POL), SUNDAY 23 APRIL 2023

Going back a week, we had yet another World Athletics Race Walking Tour Gold meet with the Korzeniowski Warsaw Race Walking Cup, which included the Polish 20km Roadwalk Championships. There were lots of South and Central American walkers in attendance and they dominated the placings.

The men's 20km walk saw an exciting duel between Brazil's **Caio Bonfim** and Ecuador's **Brian Pintado**. Little separated them as they passed the half way mark with 39:33, but it was Bonfim who won out eventually with a fast 1:19:42, 15 secs ahead of Pintado, with Mexican **Isaac Palma** a long way back in third. **Lukasz Niedzialek** won the Polish title with his 7th place finish.

Peruvian **Kimberley Garcia**, the double world champion and pending 35km world record-holder, headed off fast in the women's race and was ahead by over 40 seconds at the half way mark. In an exciting second half, she tired badly and was overtaken by Brazilian **Erica Sena**, before rallying to mount a terrific fight and take the win, 1:30:16 to Sena's 1:30:19. **Saskia Feige** of Germany finished third in 1:31:25. The Polish Championship win went to **Olga Chojecka**. She finished 8th with 1:36:02.



1962 TRAINING FOR RACE WALKING - FRANK MCGUIRE

Time to add another historic racewalking book to my archive at http://www.vrwc.org.au/vrwcbooks.shtml. This week it's the 1962 publication *Training for Race Walking* by Melbourne coach and VRWC life member **Frank McGuire**.



Frank was a mighty figure on the Australian racewalking stage, firstly as a competitor and then as a coach and administrator.

He was appointed VAWC Club Coach in 1954 and attacked the task with great vigor. His innovative use of slow motion cine film to analyse walking technique was revolutionary and his recommendations that judges adopt angle judging was accepted first at VAWC level and then at Federation and Australian level. Not surprisingly, he had the job of filming the 1956 Olympic road events in slow motion for Guy Buther, the IAAF official photographer. It was at this stage (1956) that he was awarded life membership of VAWC.

Frank became an IAAF walking judge in 1959 and National Walking Coach that same year. He judged at the 1960 Rome Olympics and in the same year was appointed national walk coach. Always innovative, he tried to introduce examination by movie (video), but the suggestion was rejected by other judges.

He gained international respect and recognition as the author of numerous books on coaching and training, with emphasis on junior walkers in many of his publications. When his definitive book Training for Race Walking was published in 1962, he presented 40 copies to the club to sell for club funds.

That's how I got my copy, as a young and aspiring athlete. It is a wonderful book and it is hard to believe that it was written over 60 years ago. It reads as a much more recent tome.

One of the great things about it was the many training schedules provided to him by a plethora of the top walkers in Australia and from overseas. As young walkers, we gleamed many of our training ideas from that book and those profiles.

VALE DENIS STRANGMAN AM, 29 JUNE 1942 - 26 APRIL 2023




It is my sad duty to report the passing of Australian racewalking identity Denis Strangman, aged 90.

Denis became involved in our sport during the 1980s when his children started with the Ginninderra Little Athletics Centre in Canberra. He and his family remained active members of ACTRWC for many years and Denis made some significant contributions both to racewalking and do the wider community.

His daughter Josephine (Jo) was an extremely good young walker who medaled at various Australian underage championships in the early 1990's. Jo was unlucky to miss out on a spot in the 1995 Australian World Cup team but she did represent Australia in the 1995 World Student Games alongside Dion Russell. Both did well, Dion finishing 9th and Jo finishing 14th.

Denis quickly took on a coaching role and went on to become a dedicated official, with a passion and keen interest for the proper promotion and development of walking at all levels.

One of Denis's major contributions on the racewalking front was his tome *An Annotated Bibliography of Race Walking and Related Subjects, with Particular Reference to the Young Athlete*, published by the National Sport Information Centre in Canberra in 1990. This collected together in one place some 750 racewalking references (articles and books), with commentaries where possible. This was the first resource of this kind, providing an excellent aid for teachers, coaches, parents and aspiring athletes. All the books and articles referenced were available for loan via the NSIC and remain there to this day.



Denis eventually passed onto me all his walking archives, including the 2 full boxes which contained all these references in hard copy, along with a copy of the reference document itself.

Denis was a senior Federal public servant in his working life and an online search shows a number of articles and Govt submissions, penned under his name. But it was in one particular area that he received his greatest accolades, being awarded an AM in 2015 "For significant service to community health through advocacy, public policy, and support organisations for people with brain tumours." 1

When his wife Margaret died from a malignant primary brain tumour in 2001, he gathered like minded people from around the world and formed the International Brain Tumour Alliance (IBTA), for which he was the Foundation Chair (2005-2014).

The Canberra Times obituary reads as follows ²

Beloved husband of Margaret (dec).

Loved and loving father of Josephine and Drago, Kieran and Kristy, Peter, Bryan and Kylie, and Gregory. Treasured Grandad to Abigail, Charlotte, Amelia, Caroline, Xavier and Laila. Friend, advocate and mentor to many.

Forever in our hearts.

The funeral service for Denis will be held in St Thomas Aquinas Catholic Church, Lhotsky Street, Charnwood on Tuesday, 9 May 2023, commencing at 11am.

Burial will follow at Gungahlin Cemetery.
