WE LEARN MORE ABOUT THE CHANGING SHAPE OF RACEWALKING

Readers will remember Stuart Cooper's article *PARIS 2024: Exit the 50km/35km. Enter the 'fake marathon'* which led issue 14 of our newsletter last month (see http://www.vrwc.org.au/newsletters/heelandtoe-2023-num14.pdf).

First it was a case of getting rid of the 50km and replacing it with a 35km walk. This lasted one Olympics and now it too is going, to be replaced by this questionable marathon walk relay. This was all announced by World Athletics in their press release https://worldathletics.org/news/press-releases/olympic-race-walking-event-paris.

They pushed out the idea but we all said NO. So they went ahead anyway and did it. So much for a shared vision!

Now the landscape looks even bleaker, with an email emanating from World Athletics foreshadowing that the 35km walk will be removed from the 2024 Race Walking Team Championships in Antalya, Turkey, to be replaced by this new marathon relay. Thanks to the concerned official who has forwarded it to us.

Marathon Race Walk Mixed Relay

Further to the approval and announcement of the new Marathon Race Walk Mixed Relay, a specific Working Group in representation of athletes, coaches, judges and Member Federations was appointed to discuss the detailed format of the new event and the qualification pathway of the 25 teams to Paris 2024. Council was presented with the recommendations which were approved as follows.

2.1 Qualification pathway to Paris 2024

- The Marathon Race Walk Mixed Relay will replace the 35km at the 2024 World Athletics Race Walking Team Championships in Antalya (TUR).
- The Top 22 finishing teams in Antalya will qualify automatically for Paris.
- Up to 5 of these 22 teams can be from a second team of the same country (NOC).
- 3 additional teams (which cannot be from a country already qualified from Antalya 2024) will qualify
 through the Marathon Race Walk Mixed Relay top performance lists in the qualification period
 (31/12/2022 30/06/2024).
- To be considered for qualification purposes, these Marathon Race Walk Mixed Relay events must comply with the following:
 - Be held on a World Athletics Certified Course.
 - Minimum three International or Area Race Walking Judges must officiate at the competition.
 - Minimum two international teams, representing at least two countries, must compete in the race.
 - Each athlete must walk a minimum of 20km between their two legs. For information, in Paris, the 4 legs (M+W+M+W) will be: 11.45km, 10km, 10km, 10.745km.
 - Be conducted at a competition which is published on the World Athletics Global Calendar.

Member Federations and / or other governing bodies interested in staging a Marathon Race Walk Mixed Relay as a qualification opportunity for Paris 2024 are invited to contact our Competitions Department for more details.

2.2 Judging

This is a new event which is based on team participation only. It is also an event over 10km legs which, due to the fast pace, could make proper and consistent judging challenging. The priority is to allow every team to finish while ensuring that no team gets an advantage by walking irregularly and therefore time penalties will replace disqualifications in case of additional red cards for the team.

The judging for this event, which will also be implemented in Antalya 2024 and in Paris 2024, will be according to the following principles:

- Judging will be on a Team / NOC basis rather than on the individual athlete.
- No athlete / team can be disqualified based on poor race-walking technique and therefore red cards will not lead to DQ but, rather, to additional time penalties as follows:
 - o 3 red cards for the Team = 3 min penalty
 - 4th red card for the team = 4 min cumulative penalty (1 additional minute)
 - 5th red card for the team = 5 min cumulative penalty (1 additional minute)
 - etc.

Note that, in Paris, there will be a cut off time of 3h20m and teams who have not completed the marathon distance will be classified at the position at which they cross the finish line after the cut-off time.

World Athletics reserves the right to review all aspects of this event including judging, after Antalya 2024.

And just who is this handpicked "Working Group of athletes, coaches, judges and Member Federations". No prizes for guessing that it will have been handpicked from those who supported the proposal. It's a case of choosing the people who will do what you want and ignoring the vast majority who want to maintain the status quo. If this was politics, we would call it gerrymandering.

WA has even acknowledged in their latest press release that it will be just about impossible to judge: "It is also an event over 10km legs which, due to the fast pace, could make proper and consistent judging challenging." I pity the judges having to participate in this charade.

In my opinion, this is not yet the end game, but just a further nail in the coffin by the anti-walking forces in WA and the IOC. They got rid of the 50km, now they have got rid of the 35km and we can guess how long this relay will last. It won't work and will be dropped after one Olympic cycle and we will be left with one walk (the 20km), which is what they have always been working towards.

WINTER ROADWALK NATIONALS

As if the above news is not bad enough, an email was sent out by Athletics Australia last Friday, as follows

Nominations for Officials are now open for the 2023 Chemist Warehouse Australian Winter Championships.

The following Championships are open for nomination

Australian Half Marathon Championships (limited positions) - Sunshine Coast - Sunday 13th August Australian Cross Country Championships - Stromlo Forrest, Canberra - Saturday 26th August Australian Marathon Championships (limited positions) - Sydney- Sunday 17th September

Nominations will close - 26th May 2023, with appointments confirmed no later than the 2nd June 2023 (The Australian Marathon Championships confirmations may be delayed if we have not received final positions by the 2nd June).

As noted above, there are limited positions based on our contacts with event organisers. More officials will be required for the Cross Country Championships. We encourage officials to not book flights or accommodation until after confirmation of an appointment.

In 2023, there will be no Australian Winter Race Walk Championship.

A little one liner at the end of the email delivers shattering news to the Australian walking community. The winter season has always culminated with the Australian Roadwalking Championships but apparently not in 2023.

I was then forwarded the following email from a couple of days before

As mentioned, we have recently reviewed our Australian winter events calendar and during this process it was confirmed by World Athletics that we are unable to have two national championships of the same distance (20km), internationally recognised in the one calendar year. Due to the timing and importance of the international selection associated with our national championships, we have elected the Australian 20km Race Walking Championship in February as our official national championship this season and therefore I am writing to inform you that Athletics Australia will not be conducting our Australian Winter Race Walking Championships in 2023

As a result of this decision, we will be moving our junior national titles to either our December or February events and only be conducting the following two meets in the 2023/24 season:

Australian 35km Race Walking Championships (Dec 2023) Australian 20km Race Walking Championships (Feb 2024) I understand this is a late decision for the upcoming season and would like to offer our support for any administrative assistance you may need in continuing with your 2023 event. Unfortunately we are not in a position to assist you financially.

We currently have 4 Australian Open Championships for men and women: 10,000m Track, 35km Road, and Summer and Winter 20km Road. AA is within its rights to drop one of the two 20km Championships. I have not great issue with that, as we still have 3 Australian Championships for our Open walkers. But the question is much bigger than that.

Michelle James tells us that AA is dropping this year's Winter Roadwalk champs (ie the Winter 20km) and moving the Australian Junior Roadwalk Championships to either December 2023 or February 2024.

If they are shifted to December 2023 and scheduled alongside the 35km - at the same time as our junior walkers are competing in the Aust Schools T&F Championships - then we have a major clash. Families with junior walkers would be expected to make 2 interstate trips within a 1-2 week period. Participation numbers will be impacted.

If they are to be held in February 2024 with the remaining 20km Championship, they would be held at the same time as all our junior walkers are participating in their State T&F and LA Championshipss and preparing for the Australian T&F Champs - again, it is a very poor scheduling choice which would guarantee poor participation numbers. Families would be saving up for the Australian T&F Championships. They don't need another interstate carnival in the same timeframe.

It is my opinion that the Australian Junior Roadwalk Champs should stay in their current timeframe at the end of the winter season. They work well alongside our Second Federation Carnival and garner bigger fields than if they were held as a stand alone event. The old adage comes to mind - it it ain't broke, don't change it.

This deserves discussion and I am very disappointed that AA has unilaterally decided on a plan of action without any chance for the RW community and RWA to provide its expert input.

VRWC ROAD WALKS, MIDDLE PARK, SATURDAY 13 MAY 2023

Ok, enough of the bad news. Now onto our weekly racewalking reports – at least that is good news! Perfect conditions ensured optimal racing conditions for the 39 walkers who travelled to Middle Park on Saturday afternoon for the latest VRWC roadwalks.

Marcus Wakim and Eden Morgan led out in the longer races, Eden excelling with a big PB time of 50:01 in the 10km. Grace Louey also PB'd in the 10km with 1:05:15. But the standout was definitely 20 yo Arnika Nelson who had her first walk with us in 4 years and has she improved in that timeframe, recording a huge 5km PB of 25:31.

- Walkers must check in at the VRWC clubrooms no later than 45 minutes before the start of their race. The clubrooms are located within the Middle Park Bowling Club Complex (Mel. Ref 2K F10).

Local walker **Sebastien Bontemps** easily won the 20km. Emmanuel points out that fourth placed **Eddy Gouron** won the last World Masters Indoor Championship Pentathlon (with 1m99 in the high jump and 4m15 in the pole vault). He had wanted to try all the olympic events, so ran a marathon in April and completed his goal with the 20km on Sunday.



"This is one of the most absurd decisions there could be. I can't find a positive point: the distance is not good, it doesn't allow more athletes in the Games, or more countries in competition. It's for nothing! I want to think that it was someone who woke up in a bad mood and presented this. Yes, it was voted by the countries, but there are a hundred of them that don't even have a march", explained the coach, in statements to the Lusa agency.
