VRWC Club points races, 1 July - Middle Park

In contrast to last week, the 32 starters who toed the line on Saturday were treated to much more agreeable conditions for Saturday's points races. Five distances were on offer, with a roughly even distribution of entrants across the card.

Performance of the day was **Maddison Nash's** 8km in **41:56**. After an injury-truncated 2022 Maddie has made up lost ground with a vengeance, on this occasion giving her PB a 2:28 thumping. It was also pleasing to see the return of **Kirstin Shaw** for one of her 'cameo' appearances, clocking a creditable **46:03**. Kirstin was a regular year-round racer from 2009 to 2014, when other life priorities intervened, but she has kept fit and stepped back into it on Saturday as if she'd never been away.

Alejandro Stephens, after a measured start, gradually wore down pace-setter Eden Morgan to take the points in his first 8km race, 41:19 to 41:39. Jonathan Ho continued his run of improvement over the longer ones with a big 1:25 PB in 45:40, with Gerard Feain grabbing handicap honours.

Former Little A's speed demon **Nikola Mandic** is steadily inching his way up through the distances, a sensible approach as he settles back into the sport in his first consistent road season. Trying his hand at 6km for the first time, Nikola clocked an encouraging **28:33** to finish just 43 secs behind **Riley Coughlan**. **David Smyth** claimed the handicap with **35:51**.

It was a day of PB goodies for **Char Hay** as she took line and handicap honours with **31:49**, as did **Terry O'Neill** in the 4km. Behind Char, **Heather Carr** and **Donna-Marie Elms** had a good tussle to finish 4secs apart. **Emilie Garside** had her first VRWC win, taking the 4km handicap, while **Mietta Morgan** was the fastest overall with her **23:41**.

AROUND THE COUNTRY

** RACEWALKING AUSTRALIA POSTAL CHALLENGE EVENT ... Rules

The rules governing the State Challenge are as follows:

- The Racewalking Australia State Challenge event is a RWA club-versus-club teams competition with points being awarded within each race to the top finisher for each club.
- The qualifying period for registering times for points is July 1 to July 31.
- Walkers may compete in more than one event on the day provided the events are held at different times. A walker cannot walk in two different age groups in a concurrent race.
- Age is 'age on the day' for all walkers including Masters. Note RWA Masters is 35+.
- Full results should be forwarded to Mark Donahoo, the event moderator.
- Mark will allocate points as follows: (1 pt for first overall, 2 pts for 2nd, 3 pts for 3rd, 4 pts for 4th

- and then all others clubs will be awarded 5 pts whether they have entered a competitor in that event or not.
- Once the scores for the individual races has been determined, the overall score for clubs of 40 members or less will be divided by 1.6, the overall score for clubs with 80 members or less will be divided by 1.3 and the overall score of clubs with over 80 members will be divided by 1. Club numbers are based on membership numbers as submitted at the previous RWA AGM. The numbers have been sent to Mark from Andrew Mitchell, RWA Treasurer.
- As in previous years, the club with the smallest total wins the Challenge.

WOTW this week goes to two of the country's upand-coming young walkers, both of whom smashed 8km PBs by big margins on Saturday.

At Middle Park, **Maddison Nash** (VIC) took a 2:28 chunk from the PB she set two weeks ago, clocking **41:56**. Having set her sights on the longer races this season, Maddie is building her condition impressively and, with this to underpin the natural speed she already has, the future looks bright indeed.

South Australia's **Daisy Braithwaite**, 15, who had walked this distance only once before, tore nearly seven minutes from that time (set last year) to record a new personal mark of **44:30** in the SARWC's Interstate Challenge meet. Put this alongside her first 10km time of 53:37, set in March, and it seems Daisy is forging a similar path to those of Olivia Sandery, Sam Findlay and Nellie Langford, confirming the SARWC as a

Dylan Richardson and Allanah Pitcher win State walks ahead of International Meets

Central Coast training partners, Allanah Pitcher and Dylan Richardson won today's NSW 10km Team Walk Championships shortly before they head overseas for major competitions. Competing at the Armory in Newington, Allanah clocked 46:18 while Dylan recorded 42:29. In just 10 days Allanah will embark on her journey to the world championships in Budapest, via a training stint at altitude in St Moritz. Dylan heads to China in late July for the World University Games, but more immediately he heads for two weeks to America to attend his brother's wedding.

Teenager, Allanah Pitcher, was rather pleased with her time today as it was largely a sprint distance for her as she will tackle 35km in Budapest at the world championships in August.

Dylan Richardson was also pleased.

"42:30 today and at National I clocked 41:56, so second fastest 10k ever so happy with that," he said. Dylan had good opposition to test him, with 2022 World Championships representative **Carl Gibbons** also racing. Mid-race Carl broke away from Dylan and looked to be heading for the win, but Dylan fought back to take the lead and go on for the win.

Carl Gibbons had an incredible 2022 year where he competed at two global meets and now Dylan is following in his footsteps onto the international stage.

"For me personally it has been motivating seeing Carl at the world championships last year and on National teams and I want to be there on those teams with them (including Allanah Pitcher)," he said.

Dylan flies out tomorrow morning at 4.00am to American for his brother's wedding, then is back to Sydney for a week, were he needs to secure his visa for China, ahead of training at Chengdu in China for six days for acclimatation ahead of the World University Games.

Dylan's 2023 campaign has seen him PB in almost every race from distances from 5000m to 35km walk. But these rewards don't just happened, but at the result of hard work and discipline. Dylan gave us an insight to just how hard athletes at his level train and why he thinks he has improved so much this year.

"Last year I stepped up my consistency and the distance; I was averaging 100k training weeks and I think having that behind me helped. Then this year I've had weeks up to 150k, and consistently around the 120 or 125k mark. It is mostly walking and it is normally around twelve to twelve and half hours of training (per week)," said Dylan.

He trains early in the morning. "If I can get out and train before 8am, it is easy to back up in the afternoon with an easy 6 to 10k before it is dark."

With that much time training, Dylan is aiming to make it pleasurable.

"Competing and racing is the fun bit, but finding a way of making those 150k weeks enjoyable, not fatiguing or grinding is the goal."

Certainly for Dylan this includes getting selected for teams. I had two trips to Japan for five days and you don't get to see much, but it is an experience."

National teams on the radar for Dylan include 2024 World Race Walking Teams Championships; 2025 world championships, World Unis and World Race Walking teams championships, then in 2026 is the Commonwealth Games.

INTERNATIONAL NEWS

UKRAINE: National 20km Championships, 24 June – Ivano-Frankivsk

On June 24, the Ukrainian 20 km walking Championships took place in Ivano-Frankivsk, the usual setting for events in the discipline (next October the 35 km championships) attended by 23 athletes from different regions of the country.

In the men's event, highlight was the victory of **Serhiy Svitlichnyi** with a time of **1:23:51**, followed by **Eduard Zabuzhenko**, with **1:24:48**, and **Viktor Shumik**, with **1:24:55**. It should be noted that two athletes from the sub-23 age group, **Mykola Ruschak** (**1:26:07**), fifth overall and first in that category, and **Yehor Shelest** (**1:26:16**) reached the minimum requirements to be present at the U23 European Championships, which will take place in the Finnish city of Espoo.

Svitlichnyi, in comments made on the Instagram page, said that finally, after four long years of waiting, he won the Ukrainian title in the distance. He thanked the coach, family and friends for their support and all defenders of the State.

In the women's competition, victory was won by **Valentyna Naiavko**, who thus became champion of her country in the distance for the first time, with a time of **1:39:54**. The silver medal went to **Alina Tsvilii**, with **1:43:24**, and the bronze to **Tamara Havrylyuk**, with **1:49:40**, with U23 champion **Sofia Krylovetska**, the distance leader in that category, not managed to meet the minimum for the respective Europeans (**1:48:00**), being ranked 4th overall with a time of **1:50:57**, she who has a personal best of 1:48:48, established on the 23rd of March of this year, in Lutsk.

The best representatives of the country, Lyudmila Olyanovska, Olena Sobchuk and Hanna Shevchuk, were absent, preparing their participation for the Budapest World Cup.


