#### VRWC AV & VRWC Road walk c'ships, 16 July – Middle Park

Thanks to **Tim Erickson** for providing this week's race report:

The 37 walkers in attendance for the latest round of the winter roadwalk season were treated to a still and sunny winter morning, a vast difference to the Antarctic winter's morning two weeks previously. This Sunday morning meet saw VRWC hosting the Victorian Winter Roadwalk Championships, along with the VMA 20km championships and a variety of VRWC club championships.

The 20km races kicked off first, at 8:30AM. With nearly all our top internationals already overseas and preparing for the 2023 World Athletics Championships in Hungary, the fields were small, but we did have **Jemima Montag** there, just back from an altitude training camp in the USA and doing her own final prep at home before leaving for Budapest herself in a few weeks. She stormed straight to the front and time-trialled her way to a very impressive **1:29:10** (splits of 44:51 and 44:19). **Char Hay** was just outside her PB with her second place time of **1:51:41** while third placed **Carolyn Rosenbrock** was in PB mode with **2:03:44**. They were joined by VRWC/VMA walkers **Karyn O'Neill** (2:27:47), **Gerard Feain** (2:12:05) and **Terry O'Neill** (2:14:06).

Ian says that Nat has plans to return to serious race walking with eyes on the longer events. We look forward to seeing that unique, cheeky smile whipping around lap after lap once again!





## AROUND THE COUNTRY

#### \*\* WALKER OF THE WEEK \*\*



For the second time this year, Ballarat YCW's **Scott Peart** has taken out WOTW. Last time it was for his domination of the AV Country track titles. On this occasion, Scott produced the biggest PB performance of the day – by 2:15 – in taking 2<sup>nd</sup> place overall in the AV U18 10km championship with a breakthrough time of **47:45**.

For several seasons, Scott has been shadowing the mid-teen cohort of fast male walkers Australia is currently nurturing. On Sunday at Middle Park he made a big stride through the door. With more racing against his speedy peers, he is certain to progress further and stake his own place amongst what is already a highly talented group.

Well done, Scott. A great result and reward for your perseverance and hard work.

#### \*Honourable mentions:

- **Jemima Montag (VIC)** a solo sub-90min effort in winning the AV 20km title. Jemima is clearly in ripping shape, posting 1:29:10 in her final race before joining the Australian team in Montpelier, prior to the World championships in Budapest.
- Ela Uzun and Angus Shuttleworth (VIC) both broke long-standing VRWC 3km records in winning their age-group State titles 14:07 and 15:00 respectively.
- Kirsty Templar (SA) an improvement of nearly 5mins in wintry Adelaide weather in the SARWC 10km.
- Anouk Morgan (VIC, 7yo) a huge 1:45 PB of 12:10 for 2<sup>nd</sup> in the VRWC 2km title, showing an amazing turn of speed in the 2<sup>nd</sup> lap. What a performance for one so young!

#### NEW SOUTH WALES LANSW State Road walk c'ships, 2 July - Scheyville

Apparently it was a tough challenge for walkers at the Little Aths NSW Road walks titles, held on an undulating circuit (beside the Cross country championship course) which would have tested the young walkers' techniques on the downhill sections. The times would seem to reflect the 'safety first' approach taken by most competitors.


