## VRWC RWA Challenge \& VMA 10km c'ships, 29 July - Middle Park

Warm and sunny skies, albeit with the usual stiff northerly, greeted the 41 walkers who fronted for the annual RWA Challenge and VMA championships on Saturday. The 10 km and 8 km starters got underway first, with the Masters welcoming QLD visitor Brenda Gannon to their 10km ranks. Brenda showed she is a strong competitor, just missing a sub-60min result. Among the VMA walkers, the standout was Carolyn Rosenbrock whose 1:00:19 attracted an $87.20 \%$ rating.

Amongst the Challenge contestants, Marcus Wakim took 10km line honours for the men with 43:31, while Arnika Nelson, walking her first 10 km , showed she has great promise in the long ones in clocking 52:23 to be first woman home. Maddison Nash and Alejandro Stephens set big new PBs of 52:29 and 52:15 as their climb up the improvement curve continues.

Ariana Pashutina was the only 8 km starter on the day, but she took advantage of the 10 km company around her to post a 25 sec PB of $\mathbf{4 6 : 2 5}$.

Nikola Mandic turned on a powerful display in his first 8 km race, his $\mathbf{3 8 : 4 5}$ making the prospect of what he'll do with more training and racing over longer distances very appealing. The same can be said of Kate Siviour who ripped a huge chunk from her PB for 41:34 and would surely benefit from more winter racing.

Evergreen club stalwarts Gwen Steed and Geoff Barrow took handicap honours in the 5km, with Jade Chitty not far off her PB in being first home in 27:31. Subject to ratification, Gwen's time of $\mathbf{3 7 : 4 2}$ has broken her own VRWC W80 record for 5 km by 8 secs- well done, Gwen! Another to show big progress was Amelia Vernal, who is getting stronger with each race and who clobbered her previous best 5 km time by 51 secs to clock 34:20 .

Steve Haverley (who can always be depended on to race on Twilight Trivia day) and Mietta Morgan were our only 3 km starters, with both handling the windy conditions well. In the 2 km we were pleased to welcome, Susan Short, a newcomer to race walking, for her first road race. Susan is a Mentone Masters athlete who is keen to get into the sport, and we look forward to seeing more of her. Levi Robertson and Mya McClure took the 2 km handicaps.

The Intervals race is another of our popular 'special' races - in fact it's a mixture of race and speed training session. There are several approaches, including setting one's own pace goals and lap target times, or going out hard and hanging on for as long as you can.

In the Intervals Race, walkers choose to walk either $\mathbf{6 k m}, \mathbf{8 k m}$ or $\mathbf{1 0 k m}$ in 2 km intervals.
To walk in this event, you must be able to complete each leg in less than 17 minutes. If, for example, you walk 11.30 min for the $1^{\text {st }} \mathrm{leg}$, you have 5.30 min rest before starting the next leg. If a walker fails to finish any leg in the allowable 17 minutes, he/she will not be allowed to continue in the next leg.

The start times for the 2 km legs are as follows:

Your 2 km repetition times will be added to give you your final aggregate time for the race distance you complete.

## SPAIN: Spanish track 10,000m c'ships, 28/29 July - Torrent (Valencia)

The following report is reprinted from the website of Spanish athletics' governing body, Atletismo RFEA:

## Men's 10,000m walk

Álvaro Martín from Extremadura had an enormous resounding win in the 10,000 meter walk. From the beginning he set a very high pace, with kilometers well under 4 minutes, which meant that only Diego García Carrera from Madrid and Paul McGrath from Barcelona could follow in his wake, at first with him and then at a greater and greater distance.

Martín passed the halfway point of the test in 19:25.10, with McGrath placing himself in second position and relegating García Carrera to third. Hit by the heat and humidity, Álvaro Martín could not keep up with his own pace and slowed it down a lot in the last part, but he was proclaimed a brilliant champion with a time of 39:39.32.

The surprise came from behind, as Alberto Amezcua from Granada went from less to more and successively surpassed Diego and Paul, taking the silver and a time of 40:04.75. The bronze went to McGrath with 40:41.74 and the fourth position to Diego García Carrera with $\mathbf{4 1 : 0 9 . 7 0}$.

Sixth title for Álvaro Martín, all since 2017 except last year when he was not present in the championship. With this gold he equals Miguel Ángel López as the most successful in the history of the competition. The man from Extremadura has had a brilliant 2023, with a record of victories in the major championships he has competed in: three-time Spanish champion (20 $\mathrm{km}, 35 \mathrm{~km}$ and $10,000 \mathrm{~m}$ ), European Team Championship over 35 km (with the Spanish record included) and Spanish Championship of Autonomous Federations in 5000 meters.

## Women's 10,000 meter walk

María Pérez from Granada, the great favorite for the title, stood out from the group from the start, riding solo throughout the race. Her pace, which was high at the beginning and made her pass 5,000 in 22:20.80, decreased as she devoured kilometers, in a repetition of what we saw yesterday with Álvaro Martín.

María Pérez, our brand new 35 km world record holder, reached the finish line in 45:02.15. Third national track title for the disciple of Daniel Jacinto Garzón, after those of 2019 and 2021. The national record holder Raquel González was absent due to a viral process.

Behind María, a group was formed led by the Catalan Cristina Montesinos and the Madrid walker Lidia SánchezPuebla, with the Galician Antía Chamosa behind them, and that was how the other two medals would be played out. Chamosa precisely left her rivals in the final part and won the silver medal with 45:39.65. Lidia Sánchez-Puebla took the bronze with 46:01.92. And fourth place for Cristina Montesinos, who reached the finish line in 46:17.29.

## The Australians in Torrent

As a pre-Worlds warm-up (given conditions in Mediterranean Europe at present, not much would've been needed), five walkers of the Australian team - Olivia Sandery, Allanah Pitcher, Hannah Bolton, Hannah Mison and Kyle Swan ventured to Torrent to compete in the championships by invitation.

Kyle, sadly, found few amigos among the judges on this occasion, and we wish him better fortune in his preparation and racing in Budapest at month's end. For the Aussie women it was a hard but productive hit-out, with Olivia and Allanah impressing by taking $5^{\text {th }}$ and $6^{\text {th }}$ consecutively against the cream of Spain's walking talent. The two Hannahs ground it out gamely in the heat and will be stronger for the experience.

## SLOVENIA: European Youth Olympic Festival results, 24 \& 28 July - Maribor

Emmanuel Tardi reports on the 5000m Walks at this high-powered event for U18s. Judging from the number of PBs recorded, it was a stimulating meeting with most binging their A-game.

I was appointed as judge in Maribor (Slovenia) for the European Youth Olympic Festival. It is a multisport competition with around 4000 entries, which includes athletics.

It is for young people born in 2006 and 2007. In the Athletics program, racewalking was scheduled on Monday ( 5 k for Men at $7: 25 \mathrm{pm}$ ) and Friday ( 5 k for women at $7: 25 \mathrm{pm}$ ).

Others judges were Anna Veselova (Israel ) Alexandru Stefan (Roumania) Vasco Guedes (Portugal) Majda Areh Novak
(Slovenia) and Frederic Bianchi (Switzerland).
In the men's event, there were only 11 starters. Monfort (Spain) walked with Disabato for the first 3k, then he sped up and won easily with a new PB.

In the women's event, Kovacs (Hungary) was immediately the only leader. She reached the first km in $4: 30$. Behind her, it was battle with Suarez, Stankovic and Auvray. After 3k Suarez sped up, and we thought that she could overtake Kovacs. But Kovacs controlled the race and finally it was an easy victory for her. For the 2nd place, it was a sprint for three women, and finally Suarez kept a very small advantage over Stankovic.
