**WALKER OF THE WEEK **

This issue's WOTW goes to **Tate Jardine (VIC)**, on the strength of his huge 1km improvement in the VRWC Relay event. Walking for the 2nd-placed Team 2, Tate ripped an enormous 1:11 from his previous best time to clock **5:57** in a breakthrough performance.

In his second year with the VRWC, Tate has quietly gone about learning the technical and racing demands of the sport, as well as improving his fitness. On Saturday, welcoming the stimulus of a relay race, he also showed a turn of speed. An improvement of over a minute in one kilometer is impressive progress, and Tate should have a successful Little Athletics season.

Well done, Tate! Keep up the good work.

- Joel Byatt (NSW) a dominant PB performance in winning the NSW High Schools 3000m walk title in 13:52.06.
- Eden Morgan (VIC) On Saturday Eden took over 4mins from his previous best for 4km, a distance he hadn't raced since 2019 although he's no doubt broken it often in longer races. This one is official ... 18:39.

The VRWC's 2023 road season ended with the annual **9km Relay event**, a no-pressure, fun flexing of speed muscles followed by prizes for the winning team. Seven teams lined up for a yacht handicap start, based on each member's form as shown by their winter results. None of us ever envies handicapper Mark Donahoo his job in trying to balance teams containing such a range of ages, speed and experience, yet once again he did a grand job with less than a 20 second gap between each of the first 4 teams at the finish. While the hoped-for neck and neck finish did not eventuate, the anticipation of what might happen added to the fun of the event. We look forward to next year's relay!

The last leg (2km) had eyes eagerly watching the home stretch as the last handover held out the possibility of a surprise winner, but it was **Emily Smith** who bookended Team 4's race and guided them home for a good win. Team 1's **Emilie Garside** maintained a 19sec lead that was too much in the end for Team 7's fast-finishing **Alejandro Stephens** to wear down. The 1km distance is infrequently raced by walkers over 10 years old, so it's unsurprising that a number of our older competitors clocked their maiden times over the distance. Quickest of these was by **Marcus Wakim** who blitzed his 1k leg in **3:54.** Five PBs were also recorded, with **Tate Jardine** showing the biggest improvement on the day with his **5:57** for 1km.

World Athletics - Certification of new International Walking Judges in October

(reprinted from O Marchador – Sunday 10 September)

At the initiative of World Athletics, a new certification of International Walking Judges will take place, aimed at candidates from different geographic areas: Europe - EA, Asia - AAA, Africa - CAA, South America - South American Athletics, Central and North America - NACAC, and Oceânia - OAA, granting them the status of **Silver Level World Athletics Walking Judges**, in accordance with the new system implemented by that entity that manages athletics destinations worldwide.

The evaluation of new candidates (in South America, as we know, current members must also undergo exams, as already happened with Silver Referees, which will only be mandatory for everyone in 2025) will take place on the 21st October of this year, in the online system, and each country will be able to register up to a maximum of 2 (entrants) with the recommendation of one male and one female.

Exams in Europe, at least in this area (Portugal), will be conducted in English, and may also be carried out in French and Spanish in other geographical areas, with assessment consisting of written and oral exams and viewing videos with sequences of images collected in international competitions where candidates will evaluate and record their responses regarding the progression mode – with regard to the regulatory aspect – of the athletes.

Candidates must be at least 23 years old, have been part of a national panel for 4 years and have experience working in



national and, if possible, international competitions, naturally, able to use the computer tool during the exams and have knowledge of the English language. Those who perform positively will join the respective panel for a period of 8 years, only being removed under exceptional conditions, and must remain active and updated and necessarily participate in actions and seminars promoted by World Athletics or Area Associations.

The panel of evaluators will be made up of a minimum of 6 members (or more, depending on the number of registrants), three nominated by Area Associations and another three by the World Athletics Trainers Team, noting that the deadline for submission of the names of candidates by EA member federations will be on the 12th of this month of September, and after that date EA will announce the date of holding a preparation course for candidates from members of European federations, and it is expected that on other continents webinars are also held.

Currently, the number of WA Silver Panel members is 79, Europe is 23, Central and North America is 15, Africa is 15, South America is 11, Asia is 10 and Oceania is with 5. The main WA Panel – Gold Level, is currently made up of 23 members: 14 from Europe, 3 from Asia, 2 from Central and North America, 2 from Oceania, 1 from South America and 1 from Africa.

SWITZERLAND: Swiss National Track walk c'ships, 9-10 September - Monthey

Emmanuel Tardi is back in Willie Nelson mode (on the road again), this time judging at the Swiss track walk championships. Here is his report:

I was in Switzerland this week end. On Saturday , I was appointed as judge for national Championship on the track in city of Monthey.

Two races were scheduled: at 5:30pm, 1000, 3000 and 5000m were held, with the 10000m at 6:15pm. The 5k was dominated by French walkers who won in both men's and women's categories. The 10k was won by young Hungarian **Norbert Toth**. The women's race was dominated by Czech women.

On Sunday morning, there was the mountain race. The goal is to walk 8k on the road between altitude 420 (in Epinassey) and 1136 (in Mex).

Norbert Toth won again with time of 52:00. For this race, results are not published.

*WALK JUDGING COURSE (Updated)

(conducted by Zoe Eastwood-Bryson – International Walks judge)

This is a training and education opportunity for Officials and Volunteers at Little Athletics, Senior and Masters levels of competition.

SESSION 1 (11.30am): 'How To Put On A Race Walking Event (Track & Road)'. This covers areas such as –

- · organisation of walks competitions
- equipment needed
- venue selection and security
- officials' duties and judging requirements
- questions and concerns.

SESSION 2 (1:30pm): 'Walk Judging Course (Updated)'. Areas covered will include -

- the rules of race walking, as set out in WA Technical Rule 54
- the roles of judges Chief judge, Course judge, CJ assistant, Recorder, Penalty Zone etc.
- communication between Chief judge and course judges (inc. 2-way radios etc)
- · what a judge does before, during and after a race
- what a judge doesn't do
- judging documentation and how to complete it
- liaising with other officials (Referee, Meet director etc)
- communicating appropriately with walkers, coaches, parents etc.
- how to become a qualified walks judge, and upgrading of qualifications
- how to gain more experience at your judging

Those attending Session 1 are strongly encouraged to stay on for Session 2, especially if their knowledge of the rules of Race walking or their judging experience is minimal.

The sessions are free of charge.
