** WALKER OF THE WEEK **



Another top result from All Schools championship competition this week. On Sunday, QLD's **Sam McCure** gained his second WOTW with a stellar performance that eclipsed the 5000m time that won him the award a mere month ago. Sam's time of **20:51.23**, his first sub-21, was a 48sec PB, a championship record and a step-up into the rarified atmosphere inhabited by stablemate Bailey Housden, not to mention six other from across the country who also hold seats at the sub-21min table.

It didn't take long for the National rankings at U20 – published last week – to need editing. Sam's performance on Sunday propels him high into the top 10:

Well done, Sam. We look forward to seeing you reach more and greater heights in the coming summer, and beyond.

Honourable mentions:

• Bailey Housden (QLD) – another sub-21min 5000m to his bow in winning the QLD All Schools U17 title, also with a new championship record.

And another pat on the back for Bailey, who, while competing at the 2023 Coles Summer Carnival, wiped out Jesse Osborne's LAQ 1500m record with a new mark of **5:41.82**. Now that's moving!

- John Ronan (WA) never away from this column for long, John added another top 5000m performance to his tally with an 11sec PB clocking of 20:37.39, recorded at the WA Strive Program meeting at WAAS. Like Sam, John also climbs the rankings ladder with his result and is aimed at big things come February/March.
- Alexandra Griffin (WA) demolished her 5000m PB by 1:19 to clock an excellent 22:37.91, the 2nd fastest U20 time this year.
- Ella Cosgrave, Noah Cooke, Makenna Clarke, Milly Sharpe and Lyla Williams (QLD) all of whom broke meet records in the QA All Schools in torrential rain.

RIP Noel Blatchford 1947-2023

Australian Masters walkers who've competed internationally and who knew **Noel Blatchford** will be saddened to hear that the UK walker has passed away suddenly, following her successful competition in the European Masters Championships in Pescara, Italy. The following tribute, forwarded by David Ainsworth, is by Andrew Garner:

I'm so sorry to let you know that after a number of strokes whilst in Italy, last night Noel passed away. We are all devastated. During the European Masters Athletics Championships, Noel achieved the silver medal in the W75 3000m race walk. We are so proud of her and winning the medal was a great testament to her ability, enthusiasm, and dedication to the sport of race walking. I would be grateful if you could circulate this to anyone who knew her. She will be greatly missed.

O Marchador has posted its own tribute to Noel, which contains more information on the circumstances of her passing:

It was with great sadness that we learned of the passing of British marcher Noel Blatchford, aged 76.

Noel Blatchford, who on the 23rd of last September participated in Pescara (Italy) in the EMACS - European Athletics Championships for Veterans on an outdoor track, where he obtained the silver medal in the 5,000 meter walk (W75), would fall ill one day after her test, she was admitted to the hospital in that Italian city where it was concluded that she had suffered a cerebrovascular accident (CVA).

Unable to return to her home in Abingdon, England, due to her worsening health condition, she died in Pescara on the 20th of last month.

Blatchford, in addition to having represented the Abingdon Athletics Club as an athlete for several years and also the Southern Counties Veterans Athletic Club (SCVAC), with several national titles won, was a director and judge of the sport. He was a regular presence at international masters events at European and world level, obtaining several titles and places of honor.

To the family, friends and sports colleagues, the «O Marchador» team expresses its heartfelt condolences.

FRANCE: Meeting d'Automne, 5 November – Nogent-sur-Marne

Emmanuel Tardi presents his latest report on racing activity in and around Paris.


I was one of the judges this Sunday in Nogent sur Marne (in the south suburbs of Paris). It was track events. Weather was rainy and cloudy.

The 10k and 20k started at 10am and shorter races started at 12:15. Thirty-two starters lined up at 10am (16 for the 20k and 16 for the 10k).

Vincent Bollinger and Laurent Legentil, two teammates of Aulnay, walked together at the front for the first quarter of the race, then Laurent won easily. Celia Franchin also won easily in the women 20k.
