Race Walking Coaches Practical course (Mark Donahoo)

Saturday 1 March – Mentone

** WALKER OF THE WEEK **

The weekend's Supernova World Tour 10,000m in Canberra produced its usual high quality results from a top level field, and it's from this meet that this issue's two WsOTW are drawn.

Sam Lindsay (TAS) and Sebastian Richards (SA) made huge leaps in standard amongst some of the world's top internationals. Sam's 44:07.20 wiped close to a minute from his previous best and sees him continuing from where he left off in 2024. This looks like being another landmark year for the Launceston young gun.

For **Sebastian**, who'd not previously gone sub-50 mins, his **47:10.94** was a PB par excellence. The ability has always been there, but perhaps a special kind of spark was needed to ignite it. Whatever it was, he found it on Monday. This breakthough should give him the incentive he needs to hit the improvement trail in earnest and join a mid-teen cohort already rich in talent.

*Honourable mentions

- Milly Sharpe (QLD) had the biggest PB improvement on the day at Supernova, hacking 3:29 from her previous best to post a new time of 53:19.02.
- **Joel Byatt (NSW)** another who is ploughing a consistent field of improvement, on this occasion taking a big slice of 1:14 to clock an impressive **46:24.15**.
- Matilda Read, Pippa Read and Kobe Lewis (VIC) all produced PBs of over 20 secs in their AV Country championship races, with the Read girls easily winning gold.

Certainly, **Matilda** and **Pippa Read** had no difficulty in doing well, both returning big PBs. Young **Kobe Lewis** added a substantial PB of her own to the tally, while dad **Shaun** managed to shave some seconds from his 5000m best. **Kelly Ruddick** made it a productive day with two comfortable wins, hopefully stepping stones in her journey back from shoulder injury.

AROUND THE COUNTRY

A.C.T. Capital Athletics c'ships & Supernova World Race Walking Tour (Silver), 26/27 January - AIS

The Supernova track 10,000m, a World Athletics Tour Silver event, has become the first major competition on the calendar. It attracts elite international racers and the cream of up and coming local talent, and it culminates an intensive training camp conducted by AA Walks coach Brent Vallance. This year the races were held in conjunction with the ACT Open and U20 track & field championships, and were held at the Australian Institute of Sport athletics facility in Canberra.

Evan Dunfee (CAN) and Jemima Montag (VIC) made the most of the chance to race against quality opposition early in the year with convincing wins, Evan taking home a PB to boot. Bec Henderson (VIC) and Sandra Lorena Arenas (COL) pushed each other into PB territory, while Will Thompson (VIC) may well have felt a monkey losing its grip on his neck after finally wiping that 40:00 from his PB list.

Of the non-elite (yet) contingent, **Milly Sharpe (QLD)** and **Sebastian Richards (SA)** showed the biggest improvement with PBs by well over 3 mins. Tasmania used this meet as its State 10,000m championship, with **Sam Lindsay** taking the gold as well as posting a State U17 record with a big 49 sec PB. It was encouraging to see numerous younger walkers take advantage of the presence of so many stars to improve their own best times. It doesn't happen every week, so when it does, plunge into the deep.

To all present and aspiring Race Walking coaches

I am writing to you to inform you that Athletics Victoria have assigned a *Racewalking Practical Coaching course* as part of their coaching courses. It can be accessed through the AV members portal, search under Coaching courses. The heading about is also a link to the information page. The course will be conducted at Mentone athletic track on **Saturday 1**st **March from 1.00 – 4.30pm**.

The Racewalking course is designed to enhance your coaching expertise, focusing on both technical and practical aspects of the discipline. It covers key aspects of coaching, including mastering correct technique, implementing drills to refine mechanics, addressing common technical faults, understanding biomechanics to improve performance and prevent injuries, and planning training programs tailored to

athletes' needs and goals. This course will equip you with the tools and knowledge to coach race walkers effectively, improving their technical proficiency and competitive performance.

This course is open to accredited coaches and contributes credits toward Level 3 Performance Coach accreditation. Eligibility for the course is anyone who has a Level 1 or Level 2 coaching qualification.

For those who would like to begin their coaching journey and be able to attend the racewalking practical course, there are a few courses being conducted by Athletics Victoria that are available on their coaching page as part of the members portal. I would recommend applying for one of these courses before applying for the racewalk coaching course.

My recommendation is:

 Level 2 Development coaching course – This is mostly online and has a practical component on Saturday 9th February.

However, the other course options are:

- Level 1 Youth course
- Recreational Running Course Level 1

I am looking forward to seeing coaches at the first racewalking practical course for many years.

Editor's Note:

Club coach **Mark Donahoo** has done an enormous amount of work to get a **practical** coaching course, specifically for race walking, up and operating under the auspices of Athletics Victoria and, by extension, Athletics Australia.

This is something of which aspiring and practicing coaches have been starved for well over a decade ... a development pathway for present race walking coaches and a means of introducing the basics of race walk coaching to novice coaches, so that they may start their own development journey.

There is no way to be sure of how many prospective walkers out there (especially at Little Athletics level) have withered on the vine for want of informed coaches and mentors. Some are noticed at their centres and are clearly 'naturals', or are at least good at it or just want to do more. LAVic centres with little or no race walk coaching expertise in their ranks are urged to avail themselves of this opportunity by advertising it around their clubs.

Nor are the youngsters the only ones in need. Adults of all ages, including those eligible for Masters competition, need proper coaching advice to help them get a foot in the door to our sport, especially if time, injury or circumstance have excluded them from whatever sports they played before. We have to reach these budding walkers and help them grow. Mark's course outline below will help you to embark upon that journey:
