Interclub competitions in two states provided this issue's winning WOTW candidates, both of whom recorded huge PBs over 5000m.

Diamond Valley AC's Max Davidson (VIC, 15), competing in AV's final AVSL round for the summer, started conservatively before changing gear and surging away to win with a 1:42 PB time of **22:52.0**. Focusing on expressing his natural speed over the key 3000 and 5000m distances while building his condition in the summer heat, Max has invested in peaking in time for the AV and National championships and if his All Schools form is any guide, he will take some beating.

Liam Freundt (SA, 16) earned his award on the strength of an even bigger PB – by 2:16 – in clocking **25:44.71**. Like Max, Liam started his race in a measured way and held his pace throughout for a big improvement. This success should see Liam approach the

coming championship races with confidence, both in his form and in his racing know-how. Further improvement is within his grasp before season's end.

AROUND THE COUNTRY

** 20KM ACES SET TO FIRE IN OCEANIAS **

Adelaide, once again, will see the cream of antipodean race walking – with a sprinkling of noteworthy talent from further afield – gather for the **Australia & Oceania 20 kilometre Road walking Championships** on Sunday 18 February. (No Lithuanians this time around ... we hope 2024 wasn't the last we'll see of them.)

Going on his Supernova result in January, Canada's **Evan Dunfee** should successfully defend his 2024 Men's 'crown', while the main championship contenders, Victorians **Declan Tingay, Kyle Swan** and **Rhydian Cowley**, are in great shape and will be alert for any sign of weakening on the Tokyo Olympic medallist's part. Not to be discounted is **Will Thompson**, who broke through for his first sub-40:00 10,000m in January and whose two 35km results late last year show he has the condition to eclipse the 1:20 barrier on Sunday. The ACT's **Tim Fraser**, a big improver in 2024, also joined the sub-40 'club' in the Supernova and is a strong contender for a top 5 finish.

Several entrants will be making their 20km debuts on Sunday, or at least have no previous times listed. Of these, New Zealand's **Jonah Cropp** will be one to watch, as will 17yo **Isaac Beacroft (NSW)** and **Sam McCure (QLD).** Cropp is the most promising Kiwi to emerge for several years and, having honed his speed over the shorter distances, is ready for this step. Not much more need be said about Beacroft, other than that the furthest distance he has raced up to now – 15km at the LBG in June – yielded 1:06:02 which equates to a sub-1:30 for 20km, and nothing suggests that this amazing 17yo won't do it easily in this company. McCure, with a creditable 10,000m of 44:44.15 in January, is also capable of at least nudging that 1:30 barrier.

Barring anything unfortunate, nothing will stop **Jemima Montag** claiming her sixth successive Australian and Oceania titles. The main competitive interest, therefore, will likely be the duel between **Lorena Arenas** (COL) and **Bec Henderson** (VIC),

the only others with sub-1:30 times in 2024. On times Arenas has a clear advantage, but the Victorian is back in shape after a long stretch of injury recovery and each woman pushed the other to a PB in the Supernova 10,000m. Expect a good contest here. Never to be overlooked is Greece's **Antigoni Ntrismpioti**, the dual 2022 European champion, who exemplifies the adage that life begins at 40 along with the next racing challenge – so bring it on. Of the remaining internationals, Kiwi **Laura Langley** will be out to clock her first sub-1:40 result, while **Sharon Lisseth Herrera** (the first Costa Rican to win walking gold at a Pan-American championship) will provide good competition for a bevy of Aussie mid-1:30s walkers including **Allanah Pitcher** (NSW), Tayla Billington (QLD) and **Alexandra Griffin** (WA).

The domestic success stories of 2024 were Olivia Sandery (SA) and Elizabeth McMillen (NSW), keen rivals who pushed each other to great heights and now sit on the cusp of sub-1:30. Their 35km results at Middle Park in December, followed by a tough January training regime, indicate that this will be the day they break that barrier. Good luck, everyone!

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INTERNATIONAL NEWS

FRANCE: French Indoor National championships, 9 February - Lyon

The French speedsters were on show at the Stephane-Diagana Athletic Hall in Lyon, and **Emmanuel Tardi** was on hand to help make sure they behaved!

I was a judge in Lyon this weekend for our indoor national Championship. Eight races were scheduled from 12am to 5pm: Cadets, Junior, Elite and N2 (walkers who are ranked from 16 to 32 and who are not qualified in other races).

In the Cadet women's race (U16), **Daphné Gateau-Fernez** was the favourite (she had walked 13.19 in 2025). She had one full lap's advantage when she was disqualified by the referee because she walked many times on the track interior line.

The Junior Women's race (U18) was the strongest race. **Chloe Le Roch** was very impressive. She beat the French National record in 12'37". **Lena Auvray** and **Marine Merbitz** produced strong times too. Every walker produced a sub-15' result.

In the Junior Men's race (U18), **Bastien Picard** walked a strong **20'14** for 5000m.

In the Women's Elite race, **Ana Delahaie** was alone in front of the pack and won easily. **Vanessa Denisselle** (5th in the race in 13'17") beat the French Masters record (W40). The previous record dated from 1987 (Suzanne Griesbach 13'26")

In the Men's Elite race, **Gabriel Bordier** walked with a very regular tempo (3'40" at each kilometer). He finished with a very good **18'19"** (close to Yohann Diniz's record of 18'17".)

GUATEMALA: Guatemala Race Walking Championships, 2 February – San Jeronimo

Bernardo Barrondo and Mirna Ortíz win 20 km at the Guatemala Walking Championships

(reprinted from <u>O Marchador</u> – Thursday 6 February)

In Guatemala, the National Road Walking Championships were held in San Jerónimo (km 146), Baja Verapaz (2 February), with the main national titles in the men's and women's 20 km races being decided in the final metres, in favour of Bernardo Uriel Barrondo and Mirna Sucely Ortíz.

In the men's 20 km race, with 1 second separating the first and second placed, **Bernardo Barrondo** recorded **1:24:06**, against **1:24:07** from **José Barrondo**, both representing the S23 Race Walking Team. As for third place, Mexican **Josafat Sánchez Peña**, participating outside the championship, crossed the finish line in that position, with **1:24:23**, while **José Eduardo Ortíz**, from Race Walking Gt, closed the national podium, with **1:25:44**. There were 18 athletes participating.

In the women's race over the same distance, national record holder **Mirna Ortíz**, from the GT Walk Team, gained 4 seconds to win with a time of **1:35:19**, ahead of her club colleague, the under-23 **Yaquelin Teletor**, who achieved **1:35:23**. 10 seconds later, **Lisbeth Carolina López**, 19 years old, from the U23 Walk Team, crossed the finish line in third place, setting a personal best of **1:35:33**. Nine athletes participated.

In the men's 35 km race that opened the championship program at 6 am, the clear triumph belonged to the Mexican (extrachampion) **Jefferson Segura**, with a personal best of **2:37:27**. As for the positions for access to the national podium, **Roberto Carlos Marroquín** was the first classified, with **2:53:48**, and **Luis Ángel Sánchez**, the second, with **2:56:09**, both from the S23 Race Walking Team.

Among other events in the program for different age groups, the under-20 titles (10 km) were held by Denis Estrada (Quiché), with 44:19, and Ingrid Ruíz (Alta Verapaz), with 52:41, and in the under-18s, Carlos Ixtecoc (Alta Verapaz), with 49:33 (10

km), a race in which Mexican Erik López was first across the finish line, with 44:41, and Aneth Coc (Alta Verapaz), with 28:23 (5 km).

Saturday 8 February 2025 - Ancona (ITA) - Italian National U18 Short Track Championships 2025
 Nicola Maggio was heartened by what he saw in Ancona on Saturday. His report (published in the Marcia dal Mondo Friends Facebook group page) follows:

"Finally two great race walking events.

In the U18 Italian Indoor Championship held today in Ancona we witnessed two excellent performances.

In the women's category there were many participants so the Technical Delegate rightly decided to hold it in two sessions divided by time.

In the final overall result, victory smiled on **Valentina Adamo** who closed the 3,000m indoor walk in **13:38.87**, an excellent result at national level.

But the twist of events was provided by **Nicolò Vidal** who had already won the 10km road race in Acquaviva delle Fonti on January 26 in 42:53.

Today the young athlete from Lombardy (competing for the PBM of Bovisio Masciago) crushed the previous U18 limit of Nicola Lomuscio that dated back to February 22, 2020.

His **20:46.19** today, at the moment (it is true that the indoor season is just starting) is the best seasonal U18 world performance in short track.

Anyone who knows something about walking and has seen the streaming event will certainly have noticed that the young Lombard offers a beautiful compromise between classic and modern walking: fast, low, great feet, and a beautiful use of the hips.

If I see good morning from the morning, today could really be a "good day" for youth walking in Italy."

Mexican Palma sets new Mile Walk best - indoor and out

It was an evening of speed, speed and speed at the indoor Nike Track & Field Centre in The Armory, New York, with world records and bests falling as if they were mediocre. US distance runners Grant Fisher (3000m) and Yared Nuguse (Mile) and Australia's Cameron Myers (U20 Mile and 1500m) gave the running fans a feast of new marks to dine out on.

The tenor of the evening, however, had been set earlier by two pre-competition races. Trinidad & Tobago sprinter Lisa Raye set a new world U18 best for 60m. Perhaps Mexican walker **Ever Palma**, who raced earlier, had been her inspiration?

World Athletics' Jon Mulkeen takes up the story:

'Just minutes before the girls' 60m, Mexico's **Ever Palma** smashed the world indoor best for the rarely contested mile race walk. Sweden's multiple world medallist **Perseus Karlstrom**, who is also coach to Palma, led for the first 1000m before Palma darted to the front and opened up a clear gap on the rest of the field.

'Palma crossed the line in **5:24.50**, not only taking nine seconds off the previous world indoor best but also going several seconds faster than the outdoor world best for the distance. Karlstrom finished second in 5:32.34, also inside the previous world indoor best.'

To all present and aspiring Race Walking coaches

I am writing to you to inform you that Athletics Victoria have assigned a *Racewalking Practical Coaching course* as part of their coaching courses. It can be accessed through the AV members portal, search under Coaching courses. The heading about is also a link to the information page. The course will be conducted at Mentone athletic track on **Saturday 1**st **March from 1.00 – 4.30pm**.

The Racewalking course is designed to enhance your coaching expertise, focusing on both technical and practical aspects of the discipline. It covers key aspects of coaching, including mastering correct technique, implementing drills to refine mechanics, addressing common technical faults, understanding biomechanics to improve performance and prevent injuries, and planning training programs tailored to athletes' needs and goals. This course will equip you with the tools and knowledge to coach race walkers effectively, improving their technical proficiency and competitive performance.

This course is open to accredited coaches and contributes credits toward Level 3 Performance Coach accreditation. Eligibility for the course is anyone who has a Level 1 or Level 2 coaching qualification.

For those who would like to begin their coaching journey and be able to attend the racewalking practical course, there are a few courses being conducted by Athletics Victoria that are available on their coaching page as part of the members portal. I would recommend applying for one of these courses before applying for the racewalk coaching course.

My recommendation is:

• Level 2 Development coaching course – This is mostly online and has a practical component on Saturday 9th February.

However, the other course options are:

- Level 1 Youth course
- Recreational Running Course Level 1

I am looking forward to seeing coaches at the first racewalking practical course for many years.

Editor's Note:

Club coach **Mark Donahoo** has done an enormous amount of work to get a **practical** coaching course, specifically for race walking, up and operating under the auspices of Athletics Victoria and, by extension, Athletics Australia.

This is something of which aspiring and practicing coaches have been starved for well over a decade ... a development pathway for present race walking coaches and a means of introducing the basics of race walk coaching to novice coaches, so that they may start their own development journey.

There is no way to be sure of how many prospective walkers out there (especially at Little Athletics level) have withered on the vine for want of informed coaches and mentors. Some are noticed at their centres and are clearly 'naturals', or are at least good at it or just want to do more. LAVic centres with little or no race walk coaching expertise in their ranks are urged to avail themselves of this opportunity by advertising it around their clubs.

Nor are the youngsters the only ones in need. Adults of all ages, including those eligible for Masters competition, need proper coaching advice to help them get a foot in the door to our sport, especially if time, injury or circumstance have excluded them from whatever sports they played before. We have to reach these budding walkers and help them grow. Mark's course outline below will help you to embark upon that journey:
